The 2011 ARC Election will be held during the May 11, 2011 General Meeting. The election will be held to fill three two-year terms which will be completed May 2013. Members elected will serve beginning with the June 14, 2011 ARC meeting.

Once the committee is in place, in addition to electing ARC officers, two members are appointed by the committee to represent the ARC on the PHA Executive Board. Please be aware that, if elected, you may be asked to serve in this capacity as well.

The committee meets on the second Tuesday of each month; special meetings are scheduled as needed. Each committee member is assigned responsibilities requiring four or more hours to complete during the month outside the meeting.



he Pinery Architectural Review Committee of the Pinery Homeowners' Association, Inc. continues its work to maintain the standard of quality and beauty we all appreciate here in the Pinery.

The ARC is comprised of seven members who are elected for alternate two-year terms. Election for three or four positions is held during the May PHA General meeting. The ARC meets the second Tuesday of every month (unless otherwise announced via this newsletter) at 6:30 p.m. in the Community Room of the Pinery Fire Station. The ARC has covenant enforcement responsibility for Pinery Filings 1 through 8A (including Pinery Estates) and Fairway Ridge, almost 1900 properties.

The committee serves without compensation. ARC office hours are Tuesday through Thursday 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. The office is also staffed on Fridays prior to ARC meetings.

In an effort to address homeowner issues as quickly as possible at meetings, homeowner submittals received by noon on Friday prior to the meetings are reviewed from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. Review of any new construction submittals begin at 7:30 p.m. or when homeowner reviews are concluded. Submittals received after noon on the Friday are heard after other issues are discussed at the meeting.

as possible with our beautiful natural environment covenants require all structures in the Pinery to be in earth tones indigenous to the area. This covenant restriction is a primary factor in the unique character of the Pinery. A sample board of approved shades is available in the Pinery HOA office. Some colors not allowed are white, black, red, blue, yellow, purple, orange and pink.

Submittal for architectural review is not required if repainting using the same colors <u>previously approved</u> by the Architectural Review Committee. If

your current colors pre-date your ownership or you are in any way unsure of the approval status of the colors on your house (e.g., if you don't have an ARC approval letter on file), please submit samples of the colors prior to repainting. Re-application of an unapproved color represents a new violation, with appropriate ARC enforcement.

If changing colors, <u>samples</u> <u>must be submitted</u> to the ARC for review.

For shades which clearly appear within the range presented by the office color board, the ARC administrator can confirm the colors to be pre-approved. You can at this point begin paint-

ing, the change will be noted by the ARC at the subsequent meeting, and you will get a confirmation letter for your files.

If there is any question as to whether or not a color falls within the desired earth tone range, color chips submitted will be reviewed by the ARC at the subsequent meeting. Be sure to have confirmatin of ARC approval; either verbally if pre-approved or, through an ARC approval letter as described above before painting begins!



Snow Removal -Resident Responsibilities

etailed information regarding resident snow removal responsibilities is available on the Douglas County website www.douglas.co.us/ publicworks/operations/ Snow and Ice Removal.html for your use.

Pinery residents should be aware of the following:

• Any vehicles parked in the roadway, blocking access, will cause the snowplow not to clear that street. Note that streetside overnight parking is also a violation

- of Pinery Protective Covenants. (See below.)
- It is illegal to place any snow and ice from private property (e.g. driveway) onto the street or public right-of-way.

From the Douglas County Website:

Anyone who violates the snow removal policy is committing a class 2 petty offense and if convicted is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$50 per violation. This ordinance is enforced by the Douglas County Sheriff's Office.

Overnight Parking

Especially during the winter months, we'd like to remind residents that streetside overnight parking is prohibited by Pinery Protective Covenants. Not only does this keep Pinery views from being cluttered with cars, it also ensures access by snow plows and emergency vehicles.

The following slip can be used as a windshield reminder for vehicles being parked streetside. Additional copies are available in the Pinery office.

Streetside Parking

Overnight, streetside parking is increasingly an issue in the Pinery. In addition to giving the neighborhood a cluttered look, parking streetside is a traffic and pedestrian hazard and makes the job of snowplow drivers and, potentially, emergency vehicles difficult. Also, overnight parking on Pinery streets is a covenant violation in all filings of the Pinery. An excerpt from covenants follows:

OVERNIGHT PARKING: No vehicle of any kind, including but not limited to, automobiles, trucks, buses, tractors, trailers, camping vehicles, boats, boat trailers, snowmobiles, mobile homes, two- and three-wheeled motor vehicles, or other wheeled vehicles shall be permitted to be parked on any public street within the subdivision projects between the hours of 2:00 o'clock A.M. and 6:00 o'clock A.M. of any morning.

Please park regularly-used vehicles properly, in your garage or on your hard-surfaced driveway; make arrangements to store other vehicles off-site. Thank you for helping maintain the beauty and safety of the Pinery.

To Help Deer, Don't Feed Them – Feeding Can Do More Harm Than Good

t is illegal in Colorado to intentionally place or distribute feed, salt blocks or other attractants for big-game animals. This problem is mainly associated with deer.

In the winter, deer herds tend to move to lower elevations closer to homes and businesses. Some people may feel the deer do not have adequate food sources in the wintertime and believe that supplementing their diets with grain, corn or hay is helpful. In fact, the contrary is true.

"People who feed deer do more harm than good," said Trina Lynch, a district wildlife manager with the Colorado Division of Wildlife.

According to Lynch, there are several reasons why a Colorado law passed in 1992 makes it illegal to feed big game animals. One important reason is that deer are the primary prey of mountain lions. "Concentrating deer by feeding can attract mountain lions well within the city limits. It may become necessary to kill these lions for public safety," she said.

The normal feeding behavior of big game animals allows them to spread out as they graze or browse. Artificial feeding disrupts that behavior and prompts deer to crowd together in small areas where they are more likely to be chased by

dogs and hit by cars.

Deer have a complex digestive system that is not adapted to digest bread and many types of hay. "Habituation to artificial feeds that do not meet their nutritional needs often results in deer that are in poor condition," explains Bob Davies, a wildlife biologist in Colorado Springs. (Concentrating deer by putting food out can also increase stress on the deer and hasten the spread of disease.)

Although commercial feeds are available at many stores, Division of Wildlife biologists warn against using them. "Some of these products may indicate they will attract certain wildlife species, including deer," said Davies. "People should be aware that if they place feed out, and deer consume it, they may be breaking the law." Fortunately, once people learn about the negative impacts that occur when deer are fed. most stop doing it," he said. "The few people that continue to feed cause problems for the deer and their neighbors," he added.

People who attract deer to their neighborhood also run the risk of damaging their property and their neighbor's property. "Some people are under the impression that if they supply a food source to the deer it will prevent the deer from damaging their ornamental plants. On the contrary," said Lynch; "it usually results in greater damage to your plants." Lynch recommends barriers, repellents and landscaping with native plants as more effective alternatives to prevent deer from causing damage to lawn and garden projects.

The Division of Wildlife launches controlled, emergency feeding of big-game animals only during extremely harsh winters when substantial numbers of animals are threatened. In all other cases, big-game animals are better off left to obtain their food naturally.
