PHA Trash Program Notice

An upcoming fee increase for the PHA Trash Program of \$3.00 per quarter/\$12.00 per year will start July 1, 2015.

The Quarterly Trash payment will be \$63.75 beginning July1, 2015 and the Yearly Trash payment will be \$235.00 (this includes the \$20 discount for annual payment). Customers on a yearly schedule will not pay the new rate until either April of 2016 or July of 2016.

To clarify:

 Customers who have already paid on the yearly schedule April 2015 through March 2016, will stay at the current rate of \$223.00 until April of **2016** when the cost increases to \$235.00 per year.

- Customers who pay on a yearly schedule beginning July 2015 through June 2016 will stay at the current rate of \$223.00 until July of 2016 when the cost increases to \$235.00 per year.
- Customers who are on a quarterly schedule now will have an option to convert to a yearly schedule beginning July 2015 and stay at the current rate of \$223.00 per year until June 2016.
- Customers who stay on a quarterly schedule will pay \$63.75 beginning July 2015.
 For ACH customers, the rate

increase to \$63.75 will occur for the quarter beginning July 2015. To have the cost increase delayed, you would have to stop the ACH schedule with the PHA office by June 1 and convert to the yearly trash schedule beginning July 2015.

The last chance to delay the cost increase of the PHA trash program is by converting to a yearly payment schedule beginning July 2015.

2015 Pinery ACH Trash Payment Schedule

If you are using the <u>Pinery</u> automatic pay system (ACH) to make trash payments, see the payment schedule below.

Beginning in the 3rd quarter of 2015, rates will be increased to \$63.75. This amount will be taken out of your bank account on the following dates:

Please be sure to inform the PHA office if your account changes for any reason, or if you wish to discontinue your ACH payment.

An Update from the Pinery Water & Wastewater District

any of you may have noticed a lot of construction activity on the north side of

North Pinery Parkway just past Windwood Way (if you are headed into the Pinery). The Pinery Water and Wastewater District is nearing completion on the construction of a

two million gallon potable water storage tank. This tank will provide improved reliability and more storage for fire flow situations to the surrounding community, keeping your homes safe. Construction began in October

2014 is scheduled to wrap up in July 2015. The District has received many questions about the

> construction but the most common question is "Will that big pile of dirt stay there forever?" The answer is no. That pile of

dirt will be used to bury the water tank. After construction is complete, the only visible part of the tank will be the top. The site will be reseeded and after the seed grows in and the final landscaping is installed, it will blend into the

native vegetation. You will once again enjoy the views of the Rocky Mountains. Thank you for your patience during this construction. If you have any questions or concerns related to this project or any other project, please contact the Pinery Water and Wastewater District at 303-841-2797

Is Your Property Fireproof?

There hasn't been a wild fire in The Pinery for decades. Yet fire is a natural process in Ponderosa forests. So, how much risk is there of a fire here in the future? And more importantly, how safe is your home? Can your house survive a wild fire in The Pinery? After experiencing the recent devastating fires in Colorado Springs, some say a fire here is inevitable. But there are things you can do to protect your property and minimize your risk even if a fire occurs.

On May 13th Einar Jensen, South Metro Fire Rescue Authority, will lead a discussion with Pinery residents on how to protect your home from devastating wild fire. This important meeting will be combined with the general meeting of the Pinery Homeowners Association Board of Directors. The Board meeting begins at 7:30pm. The Fire Mitigation meeting will begin immediately after.

Creating Defensible Space

Important steps you can take now to mitigate your risks during a wild fire:

- 1. Remove brush, branches and trees within 15-30 feet of your home, especially branches that overhang the roof and deck. This creates a "defensible space" that firefighters can use to defend your home.
- 2. Thin out young trees growing in tight groups. This will improve the health of the remaining trees and reduce the spread of fire.
- 3. Remove "ladder fuels" from your property. Brush and low branches allow fire to climb from the ground to the tree tops making fire much more dangerous and more difficult to control.
- 4. Request a "home ignition zone assessment." Contact South Metro Fire at 720-989-2273 or <u>LifeSafetyEducation@southmetro.org</u>.
- 5. Have your property evaluated by the Colorado State Forest Service for tree health and wild fire hazard. Contact them at 303-660-9625.
- 6. Attend the fire mitigation meeting on May 13th! Hear from the experts on how to protect your home.

Open to residents of Douglas County

Acceptable Items: oil-based paint and paint products, automotive fluids, antifreeze, vehicle and household batteries, house and garden chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, CFLs, fuels, items containing mercury, propane tanks, and car and pickup truck tires (remove from rim).

<u>Unacceptable Items</u>: business and commercial waste, radioactive waste, electronic waste (computers, TVs, etc.), explosive waste, smoke detectors, scrap metal, oil drums, asbestos, medical waste or any compressed gases other than propane.

<u>You will need</u>: a driver's license, water bill, utility bill or phone bill as proof of residency.

<u>Cost</u>: A contribution of \$25 per vehicle is requested to help offset the high cost of hazardous waste disposal.

Latex Paint Disposal Tips:

- Water-based latex paint is <u>NOT</u>

 hazardous waste, and can be safely disposed of with your regular household garbage once it is dried out and no longer liquid.
- Mix the paint with kitty litter, dirt or sand to help it dry out and solidify.
- Break the top layer and stir so that wet paint underneath can dry faster.
- Dried-out cans of paint with the lid off can be discarded in household trash.

If you are not in the Pinery Trash Program, you might want to consider joining with the over 1500 other participating homeowners. The program offers state of the art trash service including Single Stream Recycling. This provides you, with the opportunity to put paper and other recyclables together into a labeled container (we provide the labels) of your choice. Recycling must be separated from your regular household trash, but the recycling center now separates the paper from the bottles, cans, etc. You may choose to use a container with wheels and a lid for ease of handling.

In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.

All trash starts must be received in the PHA office no later than 1 p.m. on the Thursday prior to the desired Monday service day.

("PHA") to engage its contracted trash service to collect and dispose of Homeowner's normal household waste materials at the above described Pinery residence. Homeowner warrants that all waste materials offered for collection will not contain any hazardous, toxic or radioactive wastes or substances as defined by applicable federal, state or local laws or regulations. Homeowner agrees to pay PHA in advance within 15 days of billing for trash service at the PHA's then current rates until such time as Homeowner notifies PHA of Homeowner's termination from the PHA trash program. Failure to pay as specified which results in rebilling and/or termination will incur fees to cover the PHA cost of these actions. Homeowner shall be solely responsible to the contracted trash service for any additional services requested which are not included in PHA's normal trash program. Homeowner acknowledges and agrees: 1) that PHA is merely acting as a billing agent for the contracted trash service; 2) that Homeowner shall not receive any

refund upon termination of Homeowner's participation in PHA trash program unless Homeowner provides advance notice to PHA, including address to which refund should be sent; and 3) that PHA will not be liable for any act or failure to act on the part of the contracted trash service, including, without limitation, violation of laws or regulations, injury or death to persons or animals and loss or damage to property or the environment.
