9-1-1 For Kids Public Education

n 2014, the Parker & Lone Tree Communications Center received 14,910 calls on the 9-1-1 system. Many of these callers are young children who may be frightened and alone. Unfortunately, children are usually unfamiliar with what to do and say once they have reached the 9-1-1 center. With the growing need to educate children about the use of 9-1-1, there has been a program created called 9-1-1 for Kids, Inc.® that has been adapted by the Parker & Lone Tree Communications Center. The goal of the program is to teach all of the young children in the area about the importance of 9-1-1 and how to use it if they have an emergency.

Parker & Lone Tree Communications Center is offering **FREE** public education presentations designed for pre-kindergarten to second grade kids. The presentation includes:

- A group discussion titled "Is This an Emergency?"
- A 12 minute video titled, "9-1-1: Getting Help is Easy" with Cell Phone Sally and her friends show children how to use different phone technologies to call 9-1-1.
- Each child is given the opportunity to practice calling 9-1-1 with our simulator.
- Each child is provided information to take home and discuss with their families as well as a goody bag and certificate.



Adapting to a Normal Wildfire Season by Einar Jensen, Life Safety Educator South Metro Fire Rescue Authority

The National Interagency Fire Center predicted a normal wildfire season for our part of Colorado in 2015, but what does normal mean?

Most importantly, wildfires do occur during normal seasons when the three parts of the Fire Triangle unite properly.

The Fire Triangle, if you don't recall from school, consists of oxygen, heat and fuel. Fortunately, our atmosphere traps plenty of oxygen near the Earth's surface for us. That hasn't changed. As we've discussed previously, there is still plenty of fuel – built and growing – in The Pinery.

The other component also is normal. Afternoon lightning strikes, fireworks, discarded cigarette butts, periodic spontaneous combustion and human carelessness will provide heat sources. Therefore, wildfires remain possible in this neighborhood.

Wildfires that do ignite could benefit from our recent weather.

The rainstorms of May have provided a false sense of security. That extra moisture certainly saturated the living, dead and built fuels in the spring, but it also enabled vegetation to grow quickly and densely. Grasses in particular are much denser than usual.

Each of those fuels responded to the rain and higher than usual relative humidity by absorbing water. And each fuel also will respond to sunlight, wind and lower relative humidity. As water evaporates from those fuels, the fuels will ignite more easily.

Remember the freezing temperatures we experienced last fall? Those temperatures were uncomfortable for us, and deadly for many shrubs and trees. Residents should trim and remove dead branches and trunks from their property to reduce the amount of fuel available for future fires.

Douglas County will do its part this year, too. Working on its open space parcels, the Douglas County Hazard Mitigation Team will prune low hanging tree limbs, remove crowded unhealthy hazardous trees and trim, remove or isolate clumps of scrub oak.

Wildfires aren't only possible; they're probable. Thus it's important for all of us to adapt to that inevitability – even in normal years – and modify our properties to be more resistant to wildfires.

ife can change in a moment - make sure you are connected to the CodeRED emergency notification system in Douglas County! The system, CodeRED, is a high-speed telephone emergency notification service allowing public safety agencies the ability to deliver pre-recorded information to targeted areas within the county.

Douglas County's public safety agencies encourage everyone to register their contact information in the CodeRED system (reverse 911). Registration is not automatic, but it may be critical to your safety and that of your family.

New Mountain Bike Skills Park Open

A new mountain bike skills park in Bayou Gulch Regional Park will provide bikers of all skill levels the opportunity to improve at their craft and have a little fun doing it.

With expert areas and more intermediate terrain to be installed soon, the course currently features 12 man-made beginner and 18 man-made intermediate features, not including natural features already in place to include berms, "woop-de-dos," and rocks.

Using a green, blue and black difficulty concept similar to what one would see on the ski slopes throughout Colorado provides riders with informative trail markings to let them know whether or not they may be ready to tackle some of the challenges the course offers. Whether a beginner or more advanced cyclist, the course allows riders the chance to hone their skills close to home before heading out to some of the many rugged trails Colorado has to offer.

The 205 acre park, located on the southern edge of the Pinery Subdivision in northeastern Douglas County, began being developed in 2004 and offers a number of recreational opportunities including traditional programmed sports such as baseball, football, soccer, lacrosse and rugby. The park also features an off-leash dog area, picnic shelters and approximately 2.5 miles of biking, hiking and equestrian trails that connect to the Bayou Gulch Open Space, the Colorado Horse Park and the Cherry Creek Regional Trail.

Raccoons, Skunks and Bats, Oh My!

Rabies is increasing in wildlife along Colorado's Front Range, placing both humans and animals at risk for this deadly disease. Skunks and bats are the most significant sources of rabies in Colorado, but other wild animals can also be infected. Rabid animals usually show abnormal behavior, such as aggression, confusion, or lack of fear of people.

This is a reminder to residents to stay away from raccoons, skunks, bats and foxes that are out during daylight hours and are obviously sick.

If you do encounter one of these animals, you should contact the Douglas County Sheriff Office and they will send out a deputy or Animal Control to handle the situation.

Found an Orphaned or Injured Baby Wild Animal?

How to tell if baby animals are orphaned, injured, or perfectly fine—and what to do if they need your help

t's common to see baby wild animals outside during spring, as a new generation makes its way into the world. Unless the animal appears injured or in distress, there may be no need to rescue them.

People often mistakenly assume that a baby deer (a fawn) is orphaned when found alone. If he is calm and quiet, he is OK, and his mother deer (the doe) is probably nearby. A doe only visits and nurses her fawn a few times a day to avoid attracting predators. Unless you know the mother is dead, leave the fawn alone.

Mother deer are wary of human smells, so if you have already handled the fawn, take a towel, rub it in the grass, and then wipe down the fawn to re-

move all human scent. Then return the fawn to the place where you found him.

Only if the fawn is lying on his side, or wandering and crying incessantly, is he likely to need help. If this is the case, contact a licensed wildlife rehabilitator. To find a rehabilitator, contact Colorado Parks and Wildlife (http://cpw.state.co.us).

Douglas County Household Chemical Roundups

9 a.m.—3 p.m.

Acceptable Items: oil-based paint and paint products, automotive fluids, antifreeze, vehicle and household batteries, house and garden chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, CFLs, fuels, items containing mercury, propane tanks, and car and pickup truck tires (remove from rim).

<u>Unacceptable Items</u>: business and commercial waste, radio-active waste, electronic waste (computers, TVs, etc.), explosive waste, smoke detectors, scrap metal, oil drums, asbestos, medical waste or any compressed gases other than propane.

<u>You will need</u>: a driver's license, water bill, utility bill or phone bill as proof of residency.

<u>Cost</u>: A contribution of \$25 per vehicle is requested to help offset the high cost of hazardous waste disposal.

Latex Paint Disposal Tips:

- Water-based latex paint is <u>NOT</u> a hazardous waste, and can be safely disposed of with your regular household gar- bage once it is dried out and no longer liquid
- Mix the paint with kitty litter, dirt or sand to help it dry out and solidify
- Break the top layer and stir so that wet paint underneath can dry faster

 Dried-out cans of paint with the lid off can be discarded in household trash

New Hours and Longer Acceptance Season to Minimize Fire Hazards

To help residents clear their properties of dead tree branches and shrubbery, a slash/mulch site will be open through October 25. The site will be open from 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Saturdays only and is located at 1400 Caprice Dr. in Castle Rock. In case of inclement weather, please call 303.663.6274 to confirm the site is open.

Acceptable items: tree branches and shrubbery with a maximum length of 6 ft. and maximum diameter of 12 inches. All loads when brought in must be covered and tied down.

Not Accepted: stumps, roots, lumber, railroad ties, grass, dirt, household trash, loose pine needles, appliances and weeds.

The County respectfully requests that residents DO NOT leave materials anywhere on the site when it is closed/unattended.

Douglas County and the Wildfire Mitigation Specialists encourage property owners to use this opportunity to perform mitigation work and reduce hazardous fuels on their land. Douglas County Wildfire Mitigation Specialists offer free site visits to determine the safety of a property at no cost, upon request. Hailstorm Myths and Realities

Although the June 3, 2015 does not seem to have created the damage seen from the June 6, 2012 storm, we are getting lots of inquiries from residents and roofers. To refresh memories and inform those who are new to the neighborhood, following is some basic information.

Myth: As long as I pick a roof on the Pinery *Approved Materials* list, I don't have to submit it.

Reality: Any changes to roof materials or colors need to be submitted to the ARC so that the status of the roof can be certified and added to Pinery records. Replacing a roof with exactly the same product and color is the only instance where submittal is not needed.

Submittal can be easily done by E-mail to arc@pinery.org. Just send us your name and address along with the

- Manufacturer
- Style name
- Warranty length
- · Color name.

You can also provide the needed information using the Pinery Change Application Form available at www.pinery.org or in our office; in this case, be sure a phone number is provided. Certification is done as soon as the ARC administrator is available by return E-mail or phone call. At this point you can proceed.

The information gets noted at the subsequent ARC meeting and you will get a confirmation letter for your files. With past storms, we have found that our records from the have been very useful for residents when dealing with their insurance companies.

Myth: My roofer said he would take care of all the permits so I don't have to do anything else.

Reality: With the volume of work roofers have, many times they don't get around to submitting information for individual homeowners. If you haven't gotten a confirmation letter directly from the ARC, please contact our office (arc@pinery.org or 303-841-5305) so that we can check to see if the information has been provided. If not, we can take care of it then – better late than never!

Myth: A photo of a house I like or a digital link or photo copy of samples can be submitted for my exterior colors.

Reality: Digital representations of colors do not provide true color in most cases. Therefore, to submit exterior colors, actual paint samples (the cards from the paint store) or the paint itself (e.g. samples on wood) are needed. Be sure to indicate the use of each color, e.g. body, trim, accent (describe the intended accent use). Colors found to be clearly within the

range of colors on the Pinery sample color board can be preapproved by ARC staff upon receipt, will be noted by the ARC at the subsequent meeting and a confirmation letter will be provided for your files.

Pinery Signage Policy

Pinery Covenants prohibit all signage with the exception of one small sign per property for the sale or rental of a home. Pinery policy is that signs may not be posted off of the property. Therefore, directional signs posted on an ongoing basis are prohibited.

For an open house or garage sale, one directional sign, present for one day only at a nearby intersection, and removed at night, is allowed.

Signs not meeting this policy on the right-of-way and common properties will be removed and brought to the PHA office.

With the exception of political signage, which has different restrictions, all other signs are prohibited, both by virtue of Pinery Protective Covenants and the Douglas County Zoning Regulation.

Please be sure that companies doing work at your property are aware of the rules and regulations.

The program offers state of the art trash service including Single Stream Recycling. This provides you, with the opportunity to put paper and other recyclables together into a labeled container (we provide the labels) of your choice. Recycling must be separated from your regular household trash, but the recycling center now separates the paper from the bottles, cans, etc. You may choose to use a container with wheels and a lid for ease of handling.
