Garden Happenings—It's Winter

hat a lovely fall we had this year. We were so lucky with the moderate temperatures that lasted until November. Now winter is here with all the snow and the cold temperatures. Even though the temperatures have dropped, there are still things you need to do now for a healthy garden.

Importance of Winter Watering

Although the winter months bring snow, snow does not always provide enough moisture to sustain trees, shrubs, lawns and wildlife throughout the winter. Lack of water can be harmful to root systems, which can weaken the plant or even kill the plant. Affected plants may be subject to disease and insect problems when the temperatures warm. So during prolonged dry spells, it is necessary to water.

Here are some helpful hints for winter watering*:

Do not water when the ground is frozen

- Water when the temperatures exceed 40 degrees F with no snow cover.
- Water during prolonged dry periods once or twice per month.
- Use mulch to retain moisture.
- Water at mid-day to allow the water to soak in.

Do not forget that birds need water during the winter. Although they can obtain water from insects and snow, they appreciate an open source of water. According to Dennis Volz, birds do not like a deep source of water but something shallow. You will need to use a heater to keep the water from freezing. Remember to place the bath near an outlet for the use of a heater and preferably off the ground to prevent cats from harming the birds. Do not forget to place the bath where the entire family can enjoy it. Interested in making a bath? See information on our classes.

Resolve to be Ready for Wildfires in 2016

South Metro Fire Rescue takes every precaution to help pro-tect you and your property from a wildfire, but we can't do it alone. We need you to prepare, too. Successfully preparing for a wildfire requires you to take personal responsibility for protecting yourself, your family and your property. During a major wildfire, there simply will not be enough fire engines or firefighters to defend every home, so residents must become part of the solution.

We have adopted the Ready, Set, Go program (available at www.southmetro.org) among the resources we use to help guide you through the process of making your home resistant to wildfires and your family ready to leave early and safely. Winter is the perfect season to get ready and being ready is a perfect resolution for the New Year. Here are some tips you can follow:

- Designate an emergency meeting location outside of your neighborhood;
- Read your workplace and school emergency plans so you know how those organizations will protect your family members in emergencies;
- Ensure family members know how to use gas, electric and water shut-off controls;
- Plan and practice different escape routes from your neighborhood;
- Assemble an emergency supply kit as recommended by the American Red Cross, FE-MA or similar organizations;
- Create an evacuation plan for

- your babysitter or children in case such an order occurs when you aren't home;
- Inventory your home (as described in the previous newsletter) so that insurance claims can occur faster.

Fire is, and always has been, a natural part of the beautiful area where we've chosen to live. That's why the most important person protecting your life and property is you. With advance planning and preparation, you can dramatically increase your safety and the survivability of your property.



Who is eligible to vote in the PHA Election?





<u>Douglas County Emergency</u> <u>Notification System—</u> <u>CodeRED</u>

ife can change in a moment - make sure you are connected to the CodeRED emergency notification system in Douglas County! The system, CodeRED, is a high-speed telephone emergency notification service allowing public safety agencies the ability to deliver pre-recorded information to targeted areas within the county.

Douglas County's public safety agencies encourage everyone to register their contact information in the CodeRED system (reverse 911). Registration is not automatic, but it may be critical to your safety and that of your family.

PHA Trash Program Enrollment Form

New rates as of July 2015

If you are not in the Pinery Trash Program, you might want to consider joining with the over 1500 other participating homeowners. The program offers state of the art trash service including Single Stream Recycling. This provides you, with the opportunity to put paper and other recyclables together into a labeled container (we provide the labels) of your choice. Recycling must be separated from your regular household trash, but the recycling center now separates the paper from the bottles, cans, etc. You may choose to use a container with wheels and a lid for ease of handling.

or animals and loss or damage to property or the environment.

In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.

All trash starts must be received in the PHA office no later than 1 p.m. on the Thursday prior to the desired Monday service day.
