2017 Slash/Mulch Site Opening

Saturdays ONLY April 1 - October 28 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.

To help residents clear their properties of dead tree branches and shrubbery, a slash/mulch site will be open through October 28. The site will be open from 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Saturdays only and is located at 1400 Caprice Dr. in Castle Rock. In case of inclement weather, please call 303.663.6274 to confirm the site is open.

Acceptable items: tree branches and shrubbery with a maximum length of 6 ft. and maximum diameter of 12 inches. All loads when brought in must be covered and tied down.

Not Accepted: lumber, railroad ties, grass, dirt, household trash, appliances and weeds.

A separate pile has been designated for the disposal of loose pine needles.

- Needles can be unloaded only in this area and must not contain limbs, branches, pine cones, weeds, grass or trash.
- Needles must be separated from branches.
- Needles in garbage bags must be emptied into the pile. Residents are required to take empty bags with them from the site.

Free wood chips are available to homeowners for use as mulch. An equipment operator is onsite to load wood chips. Material can be picked up anytime during the season the site is open to accept slash.

The County respectfully requests that residents DO NOT leave materials anywhere on the site when it is closed/unattended.

Douglas County and the Wildfire Mitigation Specialists encourage property owners to use this opportunity to perform mitigation work and reduce hazardous fuels on their land. Douglas County Wildfire Mitigation Specialists offer free site visits to determine the safety of a property at no cost, upon request. Open to residents of Douglas County

Acceptable Items: oil-based paint and paint products, automotive fluids, antifreeze, vehicle and household batteries, house and garden chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, CFLs, fuels, items containing mercury, propane tanks, and car and pickup truck tires (remove from rim).

<u>Unacceptable Items</u>: business and commercial waste, radioactive waste, electronic waste (computers, TVs, etc.), explosive waste, smoke detectors, scrap metal, oil drums, asbestos, medical waste or any compressed gases other than propane.

<u>You will need</u>: a drive's license, water bill, utility bill or phone bill as proof of residency.

<u>Cost</u>: A contribution of \$25 per vehicle is requested to help offset the high cost of hazardous waste disposal.

Lighting

ne of the amenities which creates the unique atmosphere in the Pinery is our neighborhood lighting. The Pinery was designed to be a rural neighborhood without streetlights. As a long-standing Architectural Standard, most houses built in the Pinery have a yard light with a photo sensor to ensure nighttime illumination. Also, several filings within the Pinery have within their Covenants require that a yard light be present and working. This low level of lighting gives us security while still allowing much of the night sky to be visible. Please check to make sure your vard light is working!

Also, as a reminder, any addition to your exterior lighting must be approved by the ARC. This is to ensure that Covenants regarding lighting are met. Covenants require that any lighting be reflected away from adjacent residences and away from the vision of passing motorists.

Unincorporated Douglas County - Fire Restrictions

As this newsletter goes to press, there are no fire restrictions in place. However, with less moisture and increased heat, the vegetation will dry out and become a fire hazard.

During periods of high/extreme fire danger, Douglas County will enact fire restrictions for unincorporated areas. There are two stages of fire restrictions:

Stage 1:

- No open burning of any kind.
- No use of fireworks.

Stage 2:

- No open burning of any kind.
- No use of fireworks—including professional firework displays.
- No use of fire in chimineas, other portable fireplaces or patio fire pits
- No campfires at developed campgrounds or picnic area.

Violation of these fire restrictions is a Class-2 Petty Offense, punishable by up to a \$1000 fine and a \$10 surcharge.

You may want to check the Douglas County website http://www.dcsheriff.net/sheriffs-office/divisions/emergency-management/fire-restrictions/ periodically to see if fire restrictions are in place.

Fireworks Guidelines

Please remember that any personal fireworks in unincorporated Douglas County:

- must not explode
- must not leave the ground
- must not produce a loud bang

Trash Program News

Rolling Trash and Recycle Bins

If you participate in The Pinery Homeowners' Association trash program, you can now get rolling trash and recycle bins at no charge while you are in the program. These bins come in the standard 96 gallon size and a smaller 64 gallon size. These bins make getting the trash out to your curb easier and are more efficient for trash pick-up. As with all trash containers, they must be stored out of view, other than on service day per our covenants. You may of course continue to use your own trash bins if you prefer.

Special or Large Items

If you have any special or large items such as furniture or appliances, please call the WM office at: 303-797-1600 or email fchoa@wm.com at least 48 hours in advance of your pickup day to arrange for a special curbside pickup. Customers will be permitted to have "one large item" removed monthly at no additional charge. Additional large items will be charged to the resident for special pickups. (Refrigerators and freezers require certification of freon removal prior to disposal.)

Landscape waste material

This time of year, many of us our cleaning up our yards. Your trash program provides for pickup of yard waste such as leaves and grass which should be bagged or in containers that weigh less than 40 pounds each. All brush must be tied in 4 foot long manageable bundles.

General trash reminders

A total of 10 containers or bags are included with trash service, plus up to 4 bundles of brush can be picked up. If you have extra yard waste please contact Waste Management at the contact information above for a special pick up. You will be billed by Waste Management for special services.

Please **do not** put rocks or bricks in with your trash as they can damage the truck mechanisms. Additionally, all hazardous materials such as paint, gasoline and pesticides should not be put in your trash. See information on the Tri-County health Hazardous Waste Roundup in this newsletter.

Recycling Reminders

Recycling gets picked up every other week. The following can be included in your recycling:

Aluminum and Steel: aluminum cans, pie tins, aluminum foil, steel/tin cans, empty aerosol cans

Glass: food and beverage grade glass only. Please remove lids and rinse containers.

Paper: magazines, office paper, newspapers (including all inserts), junk mail, phone books, brown paper bags, envelopes (with and without windows), paperboard (i.e. cereal boxes), paper cardboard, dairy & juice containers

Cardboard: Cut and flatten cardboard into 2 feet by 2 feet squares. Make sure that all cardboard fits inside your recycling bin.

Plastic: Plastic containers number 1-7. Please DO NOT put plastic bags or Styrofoam in the Recycle. Plastic bags or other "sheet" plastic can get tangled in the machinery that sorts recycle materials. Plastic grocery bags can be taken to Target or grocery stores and put in a container they usually have near the front of the store. Styrofoam peanuts and plastic bubble wrap can be taken to UPS stores.

PHA Trash Program Enrollment Form

If you are not in the Pinery Trash Program, you might want to consider joining with the over 1500 other participating homeowners. The program offers state of the art trash service including Single Stream Recycling. This provides you, with the opportunity to put paper and other recyclables together into a labeled container (we provide the labels) of your choice. Recycling must be separated from your regular household trash, but the recycling center now separates the paper from the bottles, cans, etc. You may choose to use a container with wheels and a lid for ease of handling.

In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.



Douglas County Open Data Initiative

Lisa Frizell, Douglas County Assessor, made a presentation to the homeowners at the General Meeting on May 10 concerning the County's effort to make public information more accessible and easier to locate.

The open data website is https://data.douglas.co.us/ and https://data.douglas.co.us/opendata/#services.

Douglas County seeks to make public information more accessible to the public by providing an online "one stop shop." The categories of available information are Community, Maps, Visualizations, Roadway impacts, Budget information, expenditures, outdoor parks, lands, facilities and open space, property information, demographic, electoral and economic data and resources. Community includes information regarding permits, streets in the County and community and senior resources.

- The first phase of this initiative contains information geared to the senior population. Otherwise, there is not a single public repository of resources for seniors and their families, and the County seeks to create a single source for this growing demographic in our community.
- Another component of the first phase is to publish Assessor and Treasurer data sets. This will begin the County's efforts to remove the barriers between Assessor and Treasurer data that currently prevent efficient comprehension of this highly correlated information.
- The next phase includes Douglas County financial data, as well as Douglas County planning, building and engineering information. Additional partnerships and opportunities will be pursued in subsequent phases.

Property Value Assessment

After the presentation, Lisa answered several questions concerning property value assessment. Among other things, she explained how residential property valuations are determined which ultimately result in the property tax due on each property. The Assessor determines the "actual value" of your home every 2 years. This takes place in odd numbered years, e.g. 2017. This is called a reappraisal. Because the Assessor is working with confirmed data, the date of reappraisal is June 30 of the previous year. This means the value of the property as of that date. By law, the assessor considers the market valuation that includes sales comparisons of similar properties in the general vicinity of each property that occurred in the 24 month period prior to the appraisal date of June 30.

For example, in 2017 the Assessor begins the reappraisal process. The value of each property is determined as of June 30, 2016 based on sales data going back 24 months (June 30, 2014 to June 30, 2016). This is called the "actual value". This is why actual value at the time a house sells (sales price) will almost always be different from the "actual value" as determined by the Assessor.

Once the "actual value" is determined, the Assessor then determines the **assessed value**. This is normally calculated "actual value" times 7.96% (7.2% going forward after this year).

The **property tax** is then a percentage of the assessed value. The property tax is the total mil levy for county services, municipal services if you live in an incorporated town, school district, special districts such as water and fire and other levies times the assessed value. The mil levy usually amounts to a fraction of a percent or slightly more.

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Reata Ranch -

A preliminary informational meeting was held February 7th regarding the proposed PD Amendment to the Reata South Planned Development – Reata Ranch. Residents from the Hidden Village and the Pinery were invited.

The proposal would be for the development of 22 home sites with an average lot size of 2.58 acres located northwest of the intersection of Sunridge Hollow Rd. and Betts Ranch Rd.
