






### Have You Seen the New Dock at Bingham Lake?

### **COVENANT CORNER**

The Pinery Architectural Review Committee



#### Trees, Landscape and Covenants

W uch of the character of The Pinery is derived from our beautiful, treed landscapes.

The landscaping paragraph for all Pinery Protective Covenants requires that any diseased (or dead) trees be removed. If you have dead or diseased trees on your property, please provide available documentation such as photograph the tree(s) in question, diagnosis and recommendation from a certified arborist and plan for replacement to our office or arc@pinery.org. This will ensure compliance with covenants, maintenance of the beauty of the neighborhood and reduction of fire danger.

Some filings stipulate tree removal within a reasonable time after the condition is discovered, others within 120 days from when the condition was discovered or after receipt of notification from the ARC. In some filings, two for one replacement of removed trees is required. The Architectural Review Committee will consider variance requests to this requirement if:

- Significant trees are present on the property. Provide photos of your yard to arc@pinery.org to illustrate.
- Replacing as stipulated would cause over-crowding or exacerbate wildfire hazard.
- Because a variance would be needed, please provide adjacent neighbors' signatures.

Also, it is the responsibility of each homeowner to maintain their landscape. Mowing, weeding and irrigation (as possible within any watering restrictions) is needed on a regular basis.

The Association is very grateful to our residents for caring for their landscapes in a manner that is key to the beauty of The Pinery.

### Douglas County Emergency Notification System—CodeRED

Life can change in a moment - make sure you are connected to the CodeRED emergency notification system in Douglas County! The system, CodeRED, is a high-speed telephone emergency notification service allowing public safety agencies the ability to deliver pre-recorded information to targeted areas within the county.

Douglas County's public safety agencies encourage everyone to register their contact information in the CodeRED system (reverse 911). Registration is not automatic, but it may be critical to your safety and that of your family.

### Douglas County Household Chemical Roundups 9 a.m.—3 p.m.

Open to residents of Douglas County

Acceptable Items: oil-based paint and paint products, automotive fluids, antifreeze, vehicle and household batteries, house and garden chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, CFLs, fuels, items containing mercury, propane tanks, and car and pickup truck tires (remove from rim).

Unacceptable Items: business and commercial waste, radioactive waste, electronic waste (computers, TVs, etc.), explosive waste, smoke detectors, scrap metal, oil drums, asbestos, medical waste or any compressed gases other than propane.

<u>You will need</u>: a drive's license, water bill, utility bill or phone bill as proof of residency.

<u>Cost</u>: A contribution of \$25 per vehicle is requested to help offset the high cost of hazardous waste disposal.

## PHA Trash Program Enrollment Form

If you are not in the Pinery Trash Program, you might want to consider joining with the over 1500 other participating homeowners. The program offers state of the art trash service including Single Stream Recycling. This provides you, with the opportunity to put paper and other recyclables together into a labeled container (we provide the labels) of your choice. Recycling must be separated from your regular household trash, but the recycling center now separates the paper from the bottles, cans, etc. You may choose to use a container with wheels and a lid for ease of handling.

In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.

All trash starts must be received in the PHA office no later than 1 p.m. on the Thursday prior to the desired Monday service day.

#### **AGREEMENT**

By submitting this enrollment form with initial payment, the above Pinery resident and/or homeowner ("Homeowner") hereby authorizes The Pinery Homeowners' Association, Inc. ("PHA") to engage its contracted trash service to collect and dispose of Homeowner's normal household waste materials at the above described Pinery residence. Homeowner warrants that all waste materials offered for collection will not contain any hazardous, toxic or radioactive wastes or substances as defined by applicable federal, state or local laws or regulations. Homeowner agrees to pay PHA in advance within 15 days of billing for trash service at the PHA's then current rates until such time as Homeowner notifies PHA of Homeowner's termination from the PHA trash program. Failure to pay as specified which results in rebilling and/or termination will incur fees to cover the PHA cost of these actions. Homeowner shall be solely responsible to the contracted trash service for any additional services requested which are not included in PHA's normal trash program. Homeowner acknowledges and agrees:

1) that PHA is merely acting as a billing agent for the contracted trash service; 2) that Homeowner shall not receive any refund upon termination of Homeowner's participation in PHA trash program unless Homeowner provides advance notice to PHA, including address to which refund should be sent; and 3) that PHA will not be liable for any act or failure to act on the part of the contracted trash service, including, without limitation, violation of laws or regulations, injury or death to persons or animals and loss or damage to property or the environment.

## 2017 Slash/Mulch Site Opening

Saturdays ONLY April 1 - October 28 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.

To help residents clear their properties of dead tree branches and shrubbery, a slash/mulch site will be open through October 28. The site will be open from 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Saturdays only and is located at 1400 Caprice Dr. in Castle Rock. In case of inclement weather, please call 303.663.6274 to confirm the site is open.

Acceptable items: tree branches and shrubbery with a maximum length of 6 ft. and maximum diameter of 12 inches. All loads when brought in must be covered and tied down.

**Not Accepted:** lumber, railroad ties, grass, dirt, household trash, appliances and weeds.

## A separate pile has been designated for the disposal of loose pine needles.

- Needles can be unloaded only in this area and must not contain limbs, branches, pine cones, weeds, grass or trash.
- Needles must be separated from branches.
- Needles in garbage bags must be emptied into the pile. Residents are required to take empty bags with them from the site.

Free wood chips are available to homeowners for use as mulch. An equipment operator is onsite to load wood chips. Material can be picked up anytime during the season the site is open to accept slash.

The County respectfully requests that residents DO NOT leave materials anywhere on the site when it is closed/unattended.

Douglas County and the Wildfire Mitigation Specialists encourage property owners to use this opportunity to perform mitigation work and reduce hazardous fuels on their land. Douglas County Wildfire Mitigation Specialists offer free site visits to determine the safety of a property at no cost, upon request. Call 303.660.7497 to request a consultation for information on Wildfire Mitigation.

#### Drivers need to pay attention with school in session

School is back in session here in The Pinery, which means all of us need to pay extra attention when driving in the mornings and afternoons, especially around Mountain View and Northeast Elementary Schools and Ponderosa High School.

According to the Safe Kids organization, 80% of child pedestrian deaths occur at non-intersection locations.

We're not only concerned about young children either. Nationwide, teens have a death rate twice that of younger children and have accounted for half of all child pedestrian injuries in the past five years.

Between 2012 and 2016, South Metro Fire Rescue (SMFR) responded to 35 incidents where a vehicle struck a child, aged 4 to 18, walking or running. None of those patients died, but 60% of them were transported by SMFR to a hospital.

One of the most dangerous places for pedestrians is the school parking lot. We can all nod our heads in agreement, but it's an environment that we parents can change so that it's not as dangerous for people walking.

Always use your mirrors before moving your vehicle to make sure your way is clear. When you put the car into reverse, check one more time. That extra time gives pedestrians time to get clear when they see your reverse lights activate.

Drive slowly in the lot. You know the lot is congested and that people are walking. Hurrying is hazardous.

Drive slowly through school zones, too. Developmentally, kids are unable to judge speed and distance of approaching vehicles until age 10, and that's if they're paying attention.

When walking through parking lots, be a role model: don't use your phone, pull out the ear buds, use crosswalks and respect the instructions from crossing guards and lot attendants.

Please don't park in the fire lanes. That's where our personnel and law enforcement will park if an emergency occurs.

Most of all, be patient. School parking lots seem to be designed for aesthetics and computer-generated traffic rather than actual human behavior. Take your time and help us reduce risk in your neighborhood.


