# 2017 Slash/Mulch Site Opening

Saturdays ONLY April 1 - October 28 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.

To help residents clear their properties of dead tree branches and shrubbery, a slash/mulch site will be open through October 28. The site will be open from 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Saturdays only and is located at 1400 Caprice Dr. in Castle Rock. In case of inclement weather, please call 303.663.6274 to confirm the site is open.

**Acceptable items:** tree branches and shrubbery with a maximum length of 6 ft. and maximum diameter of 12 inches. All loads when brought in must be covered and tied down.

**Not Accepted:** lumber, railroad ties, grass, dirt, household trash, appliances and weeds.

# A separate pile has been designated for the disposal of loose pine needles.

- Needles can be unloaded only in this area and must not contain limbs, branches, pine cones, weeds, grass or trash.
- Needles must be separated from branches.
- Needles in garbage bags must be emptied into the pile. Residents are required to take empty bags with them from the site.

Free wood chips are available to homeowners for use as mulch. An equipment operator is onsite to load wood chips. Material can be picked up anytime during the season the site is open to accept slash.

The County respectfully requests that residents DO NOT leave materials anywhere on the site when it is closed/unattended.

Douglas County and the Wildfire Mitigation Specialists encourage property owners to use this opportunity to perform mitigation work and reduce hazardous fuels on their land. Douglas County Wildfire Mitigation Specialists offer free site visits to determine the safety of a property at no cost, upon request. Call 303.660.7497 to request a consultation for information on Wildfire Mitigation.

# Douglas County Household Chemical Roundups 9 a.m.—3 p.m.

Open to residents of Douglas County

Acceptable Items: oil-based paint and paint products, automotive fluids, antifreeze, vehicle and household batteries, house and garden chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, CFLs, fuels, items containing mercury, propane tanks, and car and pickup truck tires (remove from rim).

<u>Unacceptable Items</u>: business and commercial waste, radioactive waste, electronic waste (computers, TVs, etc.), explosive waste, smoke detectors, scrap metal, oil drums, asbestos, medical waste or any compressed gases other than propane.

You will need: a driver's license, water bill, utility bill or phone bill as proof of residency.

<u>Cost</u>: A contribution of \$25 per vehicle is requested to help offset the high cost of hazardous waste disposal.

# **Latex Paint Disposal Tips:**

- Water-based latex paint is <u>NOT</u>
   a hazardous waste, and can be
   safely disposed of with your
   regular household garbage
   once it is dried out and no
   longer liquid.
- Mix the paint with kitty litter, dirt or sand to help it dry out and solidify.
- Break the top layer and stir so that wet paint underneath can dry faster.
- Dried-out cans of paint with the lid off can be discarded in household trash.



# **Pinery Protective Covenants and Signs**

inery Protective Covenants allow <u>only</u> signs for the purpose of marketing a property for sale or rental. In this case, one sign per property is allowed. During an open house only, a directional sign may be placed from a major intersection (1 day). A similar exception is allowed for garage sales.

Douglas County Signage regulations also come into play when signs are placed along road right-of-ways.

State statute has over-ridden this restriction for election signage, stipulating that Colorado HOAs must <u>at minimum</u> allow election signs to be present beginning 45 days before through 7 days after a given election. This standard has been incorporated into the *Rules and Regulations as of September 13*, 2016 which are a part of the Pinery Architectural Standards.

In addition to the Covenant violation, consider the impact that any non-approved signs have on your neighborhood. <u>Think of how this</u> might impact you if you were trying to sell your house.

# PHA Trash Program Enrollment Form

If you are not in the Pinery Trash Program, you might want to consider joining with the over 1500 other participating homeowners. The program offers state of the art trash service including Single Stream Recycling. This provides you, with the opportunity to put paper and other recyclables together into a labeled container (we provide the labels) of your choice. Recycling must be separated from your regular household trash, but the recycling center now separates the paper from the bottles, cans, etc. You may choose to use a container with wheels and a lid for ease of handling.

In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.

# When Contacting WM

• Email: Many of you have found it helpful to contact Waste Management by email when requesting a large item or with any questions. That email address has changed to FCHOA@wm.com. This WM team is familiar with the PHA trash program and is available to assist Pinery residents.

- If you still need help with a trash issue, call the PHA Office at (303-841-8572).

# Yearly Trash Payment Discount Offered

The PHA is offering the same great Trash Program discount of \$20.00 if members pay a year in advance. If you were a June yearly trash member last year, you will receive an invoice in May with the discount already applied. If you want to stop your yearly payment, you can go back to quarterly payments just by paying \$64.50.

If you are a quarterly trash member, you will notice the discount mentioned on your-May Invoice. If you decide to pay for the year, the total is \$238.00 with the discount. Just send the \$238.00 for receipt no later than June 7.

Please ensure that you include any outstanding payments as indicated on your bill.

Note that the yearly discount is not available if you need to put holds on your service – sorry snowbirds!
