Pinery May 8 General Meeting

At the May 8th General Meeting, the Pinery Executive Board and Community Services Committee are pleased to present the new landscaping design for the front entrance to our community.

Your elected volunteer committee members have chosen a beautiful plan that will bring a welcomed renovation to the Pinery front entrance. Most of the funding for the project was allocated by the Board at the end of 2017 using unspent operating funds from prior years. The CSC requested bids from several highly recommended Landscape Architects and were delighted to select Tim Dunn of *Tim Dunn Designs* to craft their collective vision. The committee worked together with Tim to incorporate Xeriscape water saving plantings, as well as energy saving lighting using new LED technology. The committee hopes to lead by example with turf reduction and water conservation as major objectives.

The project will involve several phases. The first phase will be installation of a new entry monument incorporating our official Pinery Homeowners' Association, Inc. trademarked image. The project is expected to be completed by Fall 2020. Tim Dunn will attend the May 8th General Meeting to present the completed designs for Pinery residents to view.

Postal Mail Tips

The Pinery HOA has received reports of possible mail theft out of mail boxes. We wanted to make sure residents are aware of ways to keep delivered mail secure.

- If you will be out of town, place a Hold on your mail. This can be done at the U.S. Post Office website www.usps.com
- You can check the mail to be delivered each day at the same site, using the Post Office's new "Informed Delivery" service. This service can be found at the same website under the "Track & Manage" tab.
- Pick up your mail as soon as possible after delivery.

If you decide to change your mailbox to make it more secure (e.g. install a locking mailbox), just ensure that it is acceptable to the Post Office. Architectural approval is not required for a mailbox style change.

Dogs in Douglas County Must be Kept on Leash — It's the Law

Douglas County law requires that ALL dogs not on their owners' property to be on a leash at all times. Dog owners who fail to leash their pets may face a fine of at least \$50 per dog.

Douglas County offers several off-leash areas. Bayou Gulch Regional Park provides the closest area to The Pinery.

Bayou Gulch Regional Park provides 2+ acres of off-leash fun for man's best friend on the east side of Fox Sparrow Road. The dog park area is adjacent to 2.5 miles of soft-surface trails that require dogs to be on leash as a courtesy to other trail users and wildlife. The dog park is open one hour before sunrise until one hour after sunset.

Directions: Take Hwy. 83 south of Parker to Bayou Gulch Road; travel east one mile and turn north on Fox Sparrow Road. The dog park is on the right (east) side of the park. For more information please call Douglas County Parks at 720-733-6990.

If you are not in the Pinery Trash Program, you might want to consider joining with the over 1500 other participating homeowners. The program offers state of the art trash service including Single Stream Recycling. This provides you with the opportunity to put paper and other recyclables together into a recycle container. If you would like WM to deliver trash bins to your home, you may do so by emailing: FCHOA@wm.com. Please specify the size and type of bin (64 or 96 gal./ trash and/or recycling) you would like (You may have up to 3 containers.)

In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.

by authorizes The Pinery Homeowners' Association, Inc. ("PHA") to engage its contracted trash service to collect and dispose of Homeowner's normal household waste materials at the above described Pinery residence. Homeowner warrants that all waste materials offered for collection will not contain any hazardous, toxic or radioactive wastes or substances as defined by applicable federal, state or local laws or regulations. Homeowner agrees to pay PHA in advance within 15 days of billing for trash service at the PHA's then current rates until such time as Homeowner notifies PHA of Homeowner's termination from the PHA trash program. Failure to pay as specified which results in rebilling and/or termination will incur fees to cover the PHA cost of these actions. Homeowner shall be solely responsible to the contracted trash service for any additional services requested which are not included in PHA's normal trash program. Homeowner acknowledges and agrees:

1) that PHA is merely acting as a billing agent for the contracted trash service; 2) that Homeowner shall not receive any refund upon termination of Homeowner's participation in PHA trash program unless Homeowner provides advance notice to PHA, including address to which refund should be sent; and 3) that PHA will not be liable for any act or failure to act on the part of the contracted trash service, including, without limitation, violation of laws or regulations, injury or death to persons or animals and loss or damage to property or the environment.

2019 Slash/Mulch Site Opening Saturdays ONLY April 6 - October 26 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.

Wildfire preparedness begins at home. Dispose of tree limbs, shrubs and brush properly.

Douglas County's slash-mulch site in Castle Rock will open for the season April 6.

Did you know that removing tree limbs, shrubs and brush from your property is essential for wildfire risk reduction? Good news – Douglas County provides two locations to dispose of this unwanted slash.

Douglas County's slash-mulch site, at 1400 Caprice Drive in Castle Rock, opens April 6 and will remain open on Saturdays-only from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. through October 26. The perfect place to dispose of limbs, shrubs and brush, the site also gives residents the opportunity to go home with fresh mulch.

Acceptable items include tree limbs, shrubs, brush with a maximum length of 6 ft. and maximum diameter of 12 inches. Loose pine needles are accepted but must be keep separate from other items. Please note all loads must be covered upon arrival to the slash mulch site.

Items that will not be accepted include appliances, dirt, grass, household trash, lumber, railroad ties, roots, stumps and weeds.

During open season a County operated loader will be available to load free wood chips for homeowners to use as mulch. Material can be picked up anytime during the season the site is open to accept slash.

In the event of inclement weather, please call 303-663-6274 to ensure that the site will be open as scheduled.

The County respectfully requests that residents DO NOT leave materials anywhere on the site when it is closed/unattended.

Douglas County and the Wildfire Mitigation Specialists encourage property owners to use this opportunity to perform mitigation work and reduce hazardous fuels on their land. Douglas County Wildfire Mitigation Specialists offer free site visits to determine the safety of a property at no cost, upon request. Call 303.660.7497 to request a consultation for information on Wildfire Mitigation.

Track Those Fire Mitigation Hours!

It's spring and we're all pruning trees, cutting back brush, raking pine needles and doing other yard cleanup measures which mitigate our fire danger. While we don't have our 2019 plans set for the PHA sponsored fire-mitigation program, please keep track of your hours spent doing these tasks. We will be asking that it be submitted in future newsletters. Documentation of hours spent is required so that we can maintain our Fire-Wise Community status.

Please Don't Feed the Deer

In the winter, deer herds tend to move to lower elevations closer to homes and businesses. Some people may feel the deer do not have adequate food sources in the wintertime and believe that supplementing their diets with grain, corn or hay is helpful. In fact, the contrary is true. "People who feed deer do more harm than good," says Trina Lynch, a district wildlife manager with the Colorado Parks and Wildlife.

- Unwanted and Dangerous
 <u>Guests</u>: Mountain lions may be attracted to the area since deer are the primary prey of mountain lions.
- Disease: Concentrating deer by feeding them can also increase stress on the deer and hasten the spread of disease. The Colorado Division of Wildlife is reporting an increase in the problem with chronic wasting disease among the deer population.
- Health: Big game depend entirely on native vegetation, such as grasses, forbs, and shrubs. Those plants provide all the nutritional requirements the animals need to survive in Colorado, even through winter. Eating nonnatural kinds of foods can result in nutritional problems for wildlife, or even death.

Douglas County Household Chemical Roundups 9 a.m.—3 p.m.

Open to residents of Douglas County

Acceptable Items: oil based paint and paint products, automotive fluids & fuels, vehicle batteries, house and garden chemicals, cleaning products and supplies, fluorescent light bulbs, CFLs, items containing mercury, propane tanks, and pickup truck tires only (remove from rim).

<u>Unacceptable Items</u>: business and commercial waste, electronic waste (TVs, computers, etc.) radioactive waste, smoke detectors, waste containing asbestos, explosive waste, tractor tires, medical waste or any compressed gases other than propane.

You will need: a driver's license, water bill, utility bill or phone bill as proof of residency.

<u>Cost</u>: A contribution of \$25 per vehicle is appreciated to help offset the high cost of hazardous waste disposal.

Latex Paint Disposal Tips:

- Water-based latex paint is <u>NOT</u> a hazardous waste, and can be safely disposed of with your regular household garbage once it is dried out and no longer liquid.
- Mix the paint with kitty litter, dirt or sand to help it dry out and solidify.
- Break the top layer and stir so that wet paint underneath can dry faster.
- Dried-out cans of paint with the lid off can be discarded in household trash.

It is illegal in Colorado to intentionally place or distribute feed, salt blocks or other attractants for big-game animals. This problem is mainly associated with deer. <u>Violators</u> face a \$50 fine.



Recycling tips:



- **Do** recycle all empty bottles, cans, paper and cardboard.
- **Do** keep foods and liquids out of recycling.
- **Do** keep plastic bags out of recycling.
- **Don't** bag your recyclables. Plastic bags and film get tangles in the machinery.
- Don't include food —soiled items—they can turn an entire load of recycling into trash.



Many of our residents have an American flag at their property to honor our nation and the sacrifices of our troops in support of our freedom.

As we prepare for our wonderful summer holidays, we remind our homeowners to take some time to make sure that your flag's condition continues to serve that purpose. In the event the flag has become damaged or worn, removed and destroyed in a respectful manner, according to the Flag Code below, and replaced.

According to the Flag Code

The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning.

Flag poles are allowed at Pinery residences, information regarding submittal for Architectural Review can be found in the Pinery Architectural Standards at www.pinery.org.
