## President's Corner

t's finally Springtime in Colorado with the green grass peeking up through the snow left from the latest storm!

Time for an update on the Front Entry project. Phase 2 of *Beautify our Front Entry* is almost completed as the deciduous and evergreen trees have been planted. Based upon past experience, the Executive Board opted to fence the deciduous trees most at risk to damage by deer. The original project plans had extensive changes in lighting, but with the increased cost of products and labor, that design was no longer within the approved budget. Thus, the lighting plans were simplified with landscape up lighting on the rock walls and new LED light fixtures will be installed on the existing light poles in the median. The lighting and additional perennial plantings around The Pinery monument sign will be the finishing touches for the front entry. The "beautifying" of our front entry has added value to our community and a place we all can be proud to call *Home!* 

There is also hope on the horizon as we see COVID restrictions lessen, yet there are still many unknowns. The Community Services Committee (CSC) had to make the tough decisions regarding the Pinery Picnic and Community Garage Sale. The CSC opted to have a movie night in July at Lakeshore Park in lieu of the picnic. It will be a fun event for our community! ## County's Slash-Mulch Site Opens for the Season April 3

Did you know that removing tree limbs, shrubs and brush from your property is essential for wildfire risk reduction? Good news – Douglas County provides two locations to dispose of this unwanted slash.

Douglas County's <u>slash-mulch site</u>, at 1400 Caprice Drive in Castle Rock, opens April 3 and will remain open on Saturdays-only from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. through October 30. The perfect place to dispose of limbs, shrubs and brush, the site also gives residents the opportunity to go home with fresh mulch.

Due to the limited size of the slash-mulch site, please adhere to current Colorado COVID-19 precautions during your visit, stay in your vehicle until you are ready to unload and follow any instructions from on-site staff.

Acceptable items at both sites include tree limbs, loose pine needles, shrubs, brush with a maximum length of 6 feet and maximum diameter of 12 inches. Please note all loads must be covered upon arrival to the slash-mulch site.

Items that will not be accepted at either site include appliances, dirt, grass, household trash, lumber, railroad ties, roots, stumps, yucca plants and weeds.

During open season a County operated loader will be available to load free wood chips for homeowners to use as mulch. Material can be picked up anytime during the season the site is open to accept slash.

In the event of inclement weather, please call 303.663.6274 to ensure that the site will be open as scheduled.

Please note the Slash-Mulch site in Douglas County is for Douglas County residents only.

## **NOW LET'S TALK RECYCLE!**

id you know that too much contamination (unacceptable items) in a load of recycle will send an entire truckload of materials to the landfill rather than having the opportunity to become new products?

It's true. It makes our efforts to recycle a complete waste of time if we are not doing it well! So if we decide to be dedicated to recycling, we need to be familiar with the process, the guidelines and the restrictions. Little Dumpsters works hard to make sure that our efforts pay off in creating new products by monitoring the items going into the load.

If your recycle cart contains unacceptable items, they will be left with an orange tag (see sample on page 8) providing the reason and what needs to be done to remedy the issue. Once the items in question are remedied, the load can be picked up. If the trucks are still in the area, they will swing back to pick-up. Otherwise, it will be picked up on the next scheduled recycle Wednesday. Also please note that the recycle truck will not pick up wet recycle items and they may be placed in the regular trash truck.

The recycle information and restrictions (which come from the recycle center) will be posted on The Pinery HOA website. You always have the choice whether or not to make the effort to recycle. So if we chose to recycle, let's do it together and do it well!



## PRODUCTIVE RECYCLING !! In-Depth Altogether Recycling Program Information

The Altogether Recycling program is the most comprehensive recycling program available in Colorado. To keep recycling programs available and maintain the most efficient processing facility, it is important to know and understand what materials are acceptable – as well as the items that are not acceptable and may send a whole truckload of potential materials to the landfill.

## Acceptable recycle items:

- Aseptic Packaging (Milk, Juice Cartons lightly rinsed)
- Aluminum (Do not crush)
- Tin Cans (Food removed & rinsed clean)
- Aerosol Cans (Shave cream, hair spray, more – must be empty)
- Glass Bottles and Jars (Rinsed Clean)
- Styrofoam tm

#### Paper:

- Boxes Paperboard, Corrugated cardboard, flattened
- Chipboard (Cereal, Food, Tissue Boxes flattened with food bags removed)
- Junk Mail
- Magazines

- Newspapers (including inserts)
- Paper Bags
- Office Paper

#### Plastic:

- Plastic Bottles (#1-7 None marked "PLA")
- Soda, water, juice, shampoo, soap dispensers, ketchup, mustard, more with caps, lids or dispenser tops left on the bottle
- Plastic Buckets (Metal handles removed)
- Plastic Containers (Liquid detergents, cleaning liquids, milk & juice jugs, more)
- Plastic Mixed Rigid (lawn furniture, kids play toys, laundry basket, buckets with metal or wheels removed)
- Plastic Toys (All metal and wheels removed)

#### Unacceptable recycle items:

- Batteries
- Cardboard with Wax Lining Can be recycled at other facilities
- Ceramics
- Hazardous or Bio-Hazardous Materials
- Lightbulbs
- · Metals other than Aluminum or Tin
- Plastics #7 PLA Compostable Containers
- Plastic Bags Can be recycled at other facilities
- Plastic Bottles- that contained hazardous or bio-hazardous liquid
- (pesticides, motor oil, solvents)
- Plastic Clam Shells (berry or tomato baskets, to-go containers)

- Plastic Cooking or Food Sleeves)
- Plastic Plates, Forks, Spoons, or Knives
- Plastic Shrink Wrap
- Plastic Six-Pack Holders
- Plastic Syringes (or needles)
- Plastic TYVEK (Polyethylene fiber over-night mailing folders)
- Pyrex Containers
- Shredded Paper
- Steel (Handles, fencing, horseshoes, more)
- Tires and rubber materials
- Used Paper Towels, Kleenex, Napkins
- Used Paper Plates
- Windows or Windshields

Little Dumpsters allows for up to 350 gallons of trash & recycle combined. See examples below of how that might look.

If you are using carts other than Little Dumpsters carts and would like to have stickers for them, there are Little Dumpsters stickers and Recycle stickers available at the PHA office 8170 Hillcrest Way

If your recycle cart contains unacceptable items, they will be left with an orange tag like the one below providing the reason and what needs to be done to remedy the issue.

## Acceptable Items:

## Non-acceptable Items

- Items containing liquid mercury (Thermostats, fire detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, etc)
- Light bulbs of any kind
- Microwave ovens
- Poly-chlorinated biphenyl ballasts (PBC) found in fluorescent light fixtures

## The Pinery Homeowners' Association Trash Program

## Regular Curbside Household Trash Collection

- All trash must be at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on collection day.
- Collection day is Wednesday except when affected by the listed holidays.
- Please **bag all trash** even if a container is used.
- Recycle will be collected every other week on Wednesday. Do not bag recycle.
- Collection delays will follow the school delays and closures for bad weather.
- Assistance with getting trash/ recycle to curbside for pick-up is available upon request.

Please store trash containers out of view of the street other than service day.

## <u>Unacceptable Household</u> <u>Waste Items</u>

Appliances, animal carcasses, anti-freeze, oil, radioactive, paint bio-hazardous, medical waste, volatile, flammable

Please recycle these materials or utilize household hazardous waste collection programs in your community. explosive, infectious, toxic, electronics, tires, corrosive, hazardous, oxygen tanks.

#### **Carts and Receptacles**

- Each household may order two complementary carts and may select the sizes that work best: 64-gallon and 96-gallon
- You may also use your own carts or receptacles instead -or in addition- to the complementary carts provided.
- Please be sure that Recycle Receptacles are properly marked.
- Trash receptacles should be kept as clean as possible and should not pose a safety risk to the pickup crews.

## Amount of trash allotted:

- Each household may put out a maximum of **350 gallons** of trash and/or recycle per week.
- Bags of yard debris and/or bundles of branches may also be put out within the maximum 350 gallons. Branches cut to 4 ft. or less and tied—easily carried & tossed—not bagged.
- If your household needs are more than 350 gallons per week, an additional cart can be utilized each week for \$7/month (contact Little Dumpsters) or you may use your own containers.

All bags and bundles to be 40 lbs. or less.

## **Special Spring and Fall Events**

- Little Dumpsters and The Pinery HOA will provide a special weekend event (one in Spring and one in Fall) to help you get rid of those extra bags of pine needles, leaves, and yard debris from yard cleanup and a bulk item if needed free of charge!
- Details will be provided as the events are planned and scheduled.

#### **Bulk Item Pick-Up**

- Throughout the rest of the year, you may call Little Dumpsters to get a quote and schedule pick-up of additional bulk items.
- Most items will be picked up for a small fee.

Items not picked up with Regular weekly trash: asphalt, brick, dirt, manure, roofing, sod, blocks, concrete, drywall, rocks, sand, tile

## **Acceptable Recycle Items**

Aluminum and Steel: aluminum cans (do not crush), tin cans, empty aerosol cans

Glass: bottles and jars (rinsed and clean)

**Paper**: magazines, office paper, newspapers (including all inserts), junk mail, brown paper bags, paperboard (i.e. cereal boxes), paper cardboard, dairy & juice containers

Corrugated Cardboard: (flattened)

Plastic: Plastic containers numbered 1-7—None marked "PLA" plastic bags NOT accepted

#### **Unacceptable Recycle Items**

Batteries, cardboard with wax lining, ceramics, light bulbs, metals other than aluminum or tin, plastic bottles that contained hazardous or biohazardous liquid, plastic plates, forks, spoons or knives, used paper towels, Kleenex, napkins, paper plates, plastic TYVEK, Pyrex containers, shredded paper, shrink wrap, windows or windshields

## **Fire Mitigation**

The Pinery has been recognized as being a FireWise Community for 5 years. FireWise is a nationally recognized program that helps communities take action and ownership in preparing and protecting their homes against the threat of wildfire. We live in a high-risk wildfire area and need to work together to do all we can to reduce the risk of wildfire destruction to our homes and families. Some insurance companies give a premium discount if you live in a certified FireWise Community.

## Report your hours and expenses

In order to get and maintain this status homeowners need to continue with their mitigation work and report hours and expenses to the HOA. Please report your hours and expenses by going to the Pinery website, <a href="www.Pinery.org">www.Pinery.org</a>. Scroll down to "FIRE MITIGATION" and "LEARN HOW". On next page click on the "LOG MITIGATION HOURS" and input the requested information. You can report on a single day or a range of days at one time. Fire Mitigation expenses can include equipment such as pruners, saws, and contractor expenses.

All homeowners who submit hours will be entered into a quarterly drawing for one of three \$25 gift cards to local businesses.
