

Covenants and Chickens or Livestock

The Pinery HOA has received inquires regarding keeping chickens at Pinery properties. Chickens are NOT allowed. Consistently through all filings in the Pinery, the raising, keeping or breeding of "animals, livestock or poultry of any kind" is prohibited by Pinery Protective Covenants. The only animals allowed to be kept are dogs, cats or other household pets; so long as they are not "kept, bred or maintained for any commercial purpose." Covenants go on to say that any such animals shall be kept pursuant to County ordinances. Douglas County therefore enforces the leash law and other issues arising from keeping pets. Douglas County allows up to 4 grown dogs.

<u>Trailers and Recreational</u> <u>Vehicles</u>

Trailers or recreational vehicles (for more than three days maximum for loading and unloading, etc.) on the exterior of Pinery residences is viewed as a nuisance. It is therefore a violation of Pinery Protective Covenants. Trailers on properties detract from the beauty of the neighborhood and bring down property values.

Please ensure that other arrangements are made for storage of a trailer. The Pinery HOA maintains a vehicle storage lot on a space available basis. Currently, we only have a few people on our wait list. Information on our storage lot can be found on our website, at: https://www.pinery.org/rvstorage-lots To be put on the wait list, please contact the office at 303 -841-8572. Please note that you will need to provide a current copy of your registration showing that you own the vehicle and it is registered to your Pinery address.

Pinery Open Space Use

One of the amenities enjoyed by our residents are parcels of open space which exist throughout our neighborhood. The majority of these parcels of land are Douglas County Open Space, but some belong to The Pinery HOA. These guidelines apply to all Open Space in The Pinery.

From time to time, the Pinery Homeowners' Association receives inquiries regarding appropriate use of open space. Douglas County Resolution No. R-013 sets rules and regulations for Douglas County Parks, Trails and Open Space Lands. These corridors serve as wildlife habitat, allowing residents many opportunities to observe deer, foxes and coyotes as well as

smaller mammals and birds. To facilitate enjoyment of these properties, the ordinance allows for pedestrian, bicycle or equestrian use of these areas which do not have formal trails. Some uses of open space that are specifically prohibited by the ordinance are:

- Motorized vehicles
- Destruction or damage to any "building, structure, facility, sign, marker, rock, vegetation, or other object located on Parks or Open Space Lands"
- Construction of any kind without permission
- Excavation or disturbance of the soil without permission
- Depositing refuse, trash, litter, brush, lawn trimmings,
 Christmas trees, etc. except in designated refuse receptacles
- Igniting of any fire
- Collection of firewood without permission
- Feeding, hunting, trapping/ catching, molesting or killing any wildlife or disturbing of habitat
- Allowing domestic pets to harm, kill, chase, or otherwise harass wildlife
- Allowing domestic pets to be off of a leash—such leash

- not to exceed 10 feet in length; or, to leave a domestic pet unattended
- Possession or use of any firearm (including B-B guns, pellet guns, paint ball guns and air guns) or archery equipment, or any device capable of discharging a projectile (e.g. slingshot)
- Use or ignition of fireworks

Residents can report any observed violations to Douglas County at 303-660-7495 or, in an emergency, by dialing 911.

Douglas County Emergency Notification System—CodeRED

ife can change in a moment - make sure you are connected to the CodeRED emergency notification system in Douglas County! The system, CodeRED, is a high-speed telephone emergency notification service allowing public safety agencies the ability to deliver pre-recorded information to targeted areas within the county.

Douglas County's public safety agencies encourage everyone to register their contact information in the CodeRED system (reverse 911). Registration is not automatic, but it may be critical to your safety and that of your family.

Development Application in The Pinery

There is a 12.35 parcel of property North of The Pinery's North Park (bordered on the South by Sunridge Hollow Rd, Ponderosa Way and on the west by Betts Ranch Rd. and on the North and East by existing residential Development). It is currently owned by the Douglas County School District. The original owners of The Pinery, donated it to the County, as required at that time, for a future school. The School District has identified that this is surplus property and has a pending contract with a developer. The developer is requesting that the Zoning be changed on this property from school district site to a single-family residential zoning.

The Pinery HOA has had two meetings with the developer, and the homes now proposed are 28 down from 33 and none of these homes will have driveways directly to existing roads. The Pinery HOA, and residents submitted comments, as requested, to the Douglas County Planning Department in mid-June. Given all the building going on in the area, The Pinery HOA would like to have this area designated as Douglas County open space so that we continue to have an area for deer, fox, turkeys and the threatened Prebles jumping mouse that reside there. These 12 acres are adjacent to our 5 acres in North Park, creating over a 17 acre area. If there are to be homes built on this property, The Pinery would only support significantly less custom homes which would fit with the larger lots right next to it in The Pinery and in the Hidden Village neighborhood. There are some additional concerns we have shared with the County, including that additional traffic entering onto Ponderosa Way (across from Falling Leaf Circle) will be a safety issue due to the decline and curve of the road in that area. For more information on what the HOA submitted to the County, maps, as well as ongoing updates go to our website, www.Pinery.org., and scroll down to Development News. On June 21, the Developer presented the proposed plans to residents at the Pinery Firehouse. Residents were notified of this meeting by mail if they were adjacent to the property, and by The Pinery entrance "news" signs and PHA website.

The Developer will need to respond to the comments submitted. At a yet to be determined date, there will be a public meeting held by the Douglas County Planning Department. The Pinery will present at that meeting, and residents can as well. It is important that many residents attend this meeting (you do not have to speak). The meeting will be in Castle Rock. County's Slash-Mulch Site Opened for the Season on April 2 Please note the Slash-Mulch site in Douglas County is for Douglas County residents only.

Did you know that removing tree limbs, shrubs and brush from your property is essential for wildfire risk reduction? Good news – Douglas County provides a location to dispose of this unwanted slash.

Douglas County's <u>slash-mulch site</u>, at **1400 Caprice Drive in Castle Rock**, opened April 2 and will remain open on Saturdays only from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. through October 29. This is the perfect place to dispose of limbs, shrubs and brush. The site also gives residents the opportunity to go home with fresh mulch.

Acceptable items include tree limbs, loose pine needles, shrubs, brush with a maximum length of 6 feet and maximum diameter of 12 inches. Please note all loads must be covered upon arrival to the slashmulch site. ** Absolutely no dumping allowed Monday through Friday**

<u>Unacceptable items include</u>: appliances, compost, decorative wood chips, dirt, fencing, grass / hay, household trash / yard waste, leaves, lumber / pallets / railroad ties, pine cones, roots / stumps, weeds, yucca plants.


During open season a County operated loader will be available to load free wood chips for homeowners to use as mulch. Material can be picked up anytime during the season the site is open to accept slash.



Know Grease, Know Fire: Preventing Oven Fires

In terms of cooking, grease refers to animal fats and vegetable oils. It oozes and splatters from food during the cooking process onto pans, racks, burners, and nearby surfaces.

Grease that has been liberated from food is prime fuel for a fire. Heat from future cooking dries grease deposits and vaporizes it; if enough vaporized fuel, heat, and oxygen are present a fire can ignite.

Ovens are built for containing most heat, but too much heat can overwhelm even the best insulation and damage equipment.

It's critical that oven owners clean their ovens. There are plenty of horror stories on the Internet about self-cleaning cycles malfunctioning, but there are other options.

- Mix 1/2 Cup of baking soda with water to create a paste. Spread the paste on all surfaces of the oven, but not the heating elements. Wait at least two hours and consider leaving it overnight. Using a spray bottle, apply a mixture of half water and half white vinegar to the paste in the oven. The resulting foam helps to remove food stains. After leaving that for another 30 minutes, use a rubber spatula (if necessary) and rag to remove the baking soda mixture. Finish by wiping everything with a damp cloth.
- Another option involves lemons. Cut five lemons in half, squeeze the juice into a baking tray and place the

squeezed lemon ends in the tray as well. Bake at 450°F for 30 minutes. The steam will loosen the grease and grime. After the oven cools, use a damp cloth to wipe the surfaces clean.

If a fire does start in your oven, keep the door closed and turn off the heat. Once the oven cools, you can clean the mess. If the fire escapes the oven, go outside and call 911.

The ideal conclusion to this article would be "No Grease, No Fire," but there are other potential fuels that can be found in and near ovens. Instead, we'll settle for "No Grease, No Grease Fires."
