### **Architectural Review Committee Election**

The 2022 ARC Election will be held in May of 2022. The election will be held to fill three two-year terms which will be completed May 2024. Members elected will serve beginning with the June 7, 2022 ARC meeting.

Once the Committee is in place, in addition to electing ARC officers, two members are appointed by the Committee to represent the ARC on the PHA Executive Board. Please be aware that, if elected, you may be asked to serve in this capacity as well.

The Committee meets on the second Tuesday of each month; special meetings are scheduled as needed. Each committee member is assigned responsibilities requiring approximately 2-4 hours to complete during the month outside the meeting.

### Lighting

One of the amenities which creates the unique atmosphere in the Pinery is our neighborhood lighting. The Pinery was designed to be a rural neighborhood without streetlights. As a long-standing Architectural Standard, most houses built in the Pinery have a yard light with a photo sensor to ensure nighttime illumination. Also, several Covenant filings within the Pinery require that a yard light be present and working. This low level of lighting gives us security while still allowing much of the night sky to be visible.

Also, as a reminder, any addition to your exterior lighting must be approved by the ARC. This is to ensure that Covenants regarding lighting are met. Covenants require that any **lighting be reflected away from adjacent residences and away from the vision of passing motorists.** We have had several complaints that neighbor lights are shining into adjacent residences. Please check that any lighting you have complies with this.

### **Overnight Parking**

Especially during the winter months, we'd like to remind residents that streetside overnight parking is prohibited by Pinery Protective Covenants. Not only does this keep Pinery views from being cluttered with cars, it also ensures access by snow plows and emergency vehicles.

The following slip can be used as a windshield reminder for vehicles being parked streetside. Additional copies are available in the Pinery office.

### Streetside Parking

Overnight, streetside parking is increasingly an issue in the Pinery. In addition to giving the neighborhood a cluttered look, parking streetside is a traffic and pedestrian hazard and makes the job of snow-plow drivers and, potentially, emergency vehicles difficult. Also, overnight parking on Pinery streets is a covenant violation in all filings of the Pinery. An excerpt from covenants follows:

OVERNIGHT PARKING: No vehicle of any kind, including but not limited to, automobiles, trucks, buses, tractors, trailers, camping vehicles, boats, boat trailers, snowmobiles, mobile homes, two- and three-wheeled motor vehicles, or other wheeled vehicles shall be permitted to be parked on any public street within the subdivision projects between the hours of 2:00 o'clock A.M. and 6:00 o'clock A.M. of any morning.

Please park regularly-used vehicles properly, in your garage or on your hard-surfaced driveway; make arrangements to store other vehicles off-site. Thank you for helping maintain the beauty and safety of the Pinery

### **Commercial Signs**

Commercial (advertising) signs are not allowed in The Pinery. Please remove any of these signs.

### **Snow Removal Information**

### Snow Removal - Resident Responsibilities

Detailed information regarding resident snow removal responsibilities is available on the Douglas County website <a href="https://www.douglas.co.us/road-work/snow-and-ice-removal/">https://www.douglas.co.us/road-work/snow-and-ice-removal/</a> for your use.

Pinery residents should be aware of the following:

- Any vehicles parked in the roadway, blocking access, will cause the snowplow not to clear that street. Note that streetside overnight parking is also a violation of Pinery Protective Covenants.
- It is illegal to place any snow and ice from private property (e.g. driveway) onto the street or public right-of-way.

From the Douglas County Website:

Anyone who violates the snow removal policy is committing a class 2 petty offense and if convicted is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$50 per violation. This ordinance is enforced by the Douglas County Sheriff's Office.

### Some FAQ Regarding Snow Removal

### What if I have an emergency and my street isn't plowed?

If an emergency situation occurs, call 911. Equipment will be diverted for emergencies ONLY WHEN REQUESTED BY AN EMERGENCY SERVICE AGENCY OR THE DOUGLAS COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT. The Sheriff's Department is in constant communication with PW Ops personnel during snow events so snow removal equipment can be detoured to assist emergency services.

### Who is responsible for damaged mailboxes?

Mailboxes installed along roadways are at the risk of the owner. Mailboxes damaged from lack of owner maintenance, weight of snow from plowing, or vandalism is not the responsibility of the County. Postal regulations require residents to clean snow from in front of mailboxes to allow for mail delivery. Douglas County encourages the clustering of individual mailboxes to minimize potential damage during snowstorms and to increase efficiency of mail delivery. Lease (Page 2, paragraph 5)
states that the Association
does not do removal of snow.
In addition to being very
costly, plowing snow at the
lots would be problematic.
The soft surfaces at the lot
could be easily damaged and
snow would, of necessity, be
plowed in front of spaces of
lessees.

Be sure to be aware of this as you make plans for use of your stored vehicle(s).

# Electrical Safety By Colleen Potton, Risk Reduction Specialist South Metro Fire Rescue

Did you know that one of the top causes of residential fires are due to faulty electrical outlets, frayed cords, or improper charging techniques? With all of our electronics we need to ensure we are <u>using</u> them safely to prevent fires and keep your family safe.

### **Charging our devices:**

As we charge our cell phones, tablets, and laptops we need to have them on a solid nonflammable surface. As our mobile devices charge, they produce heat. If you charge your devices on your bed, coach, or other soft surface, air is unable to flow around the device. As a result, the soft surface and the charging device could heat enough to start a fire.

#### **Loose outlets:**

Do plugs fall out of your outlets? This is a clue that an electrical fire could be started inside of your wall. A loose outlet is a sign that your outlet is not making a solid connection with the rest of your power in your home. When electrical connections are not solid, sparks can be created starting a fire inside your wall. Quit using that outlet until you can have it replaced.

### Damaged electrical and extension cords:

Are your cords showing signs of wear and tear? If you see electrical cords in your home that are fraying, pulling away from the plug, or the plastic has worn off enough that wires are showing, it is time for a new cord. Do not try to fix the cords; replace them.

### **Outlets and power strips:**

Can you overload an outlet or a power strip? Yes. When you have multiple items plugged into one outlet the outlet is pulling more electricity than it was designed for. Never plug one power strip into another. Also, never plug an extension cord into a power strip. Again, that is asking too much from one outlet. This can result in an electrical fire. The danger with this type of electrical fire is the fire may start behind the wall and go unnoticed until it has consumed much of the wall.

### **Helpful hints:**

Appliances need to be plugged directly <u>into the wall</u>. Large appliances like refrigerators require a lot of power and frequently cycle on and off, which can easily overload a power strip.

Not all extension cords are the same. Some are not designed for use outside. <u>Make sure the extension cord is designed for your needs</u>.

As a reminder, never put water on an electrical fire.

Know how to turn off electricity to your home.

# PHA Trash & Recycle Program Enrollment Form

The Pinery Homeowners' Association invites you to participate in the Trash and Recycle Program offered to Pinery residents.

Trash is picked up every Wednesday and recycling items are picked up every other Wednesday.

Each household may order two complementary carts 64 gallon and/or 96 gallon. There will be a \$25 delivery fee. (You may order below.)

For a large or bulk item picked up, schedule with Little Dumpsters for a small fee **303-841-7144**.

All trash starts must be received in the PHA office no later than 1 p.m. on the Monday prior to the desired Wednesday service day. Trash carts will be delivered in 7—10 days.

In the event that further action is needed, Douglas County Animal Control, 303-660-7529, can visit with the homeowner to ensure the problem is corrected.

Also, failure to 'clean up after' has become an evident problem at the Bingham Lake Trail. Douglas County Parks and Recreation has thoughtfully provided bag dispensers and trash cans at the main parking lot and at the Thunderhill Road parking lot.

On Leash: Douglas County ordinance requires that dogs be contained or on-leash at all times. When walking your leashed dog, please be sure to take along a bag and take care of business.
