## **Snow Removal Information**

#### **Snow Removal - Resident Responsibilities**

etailed information regarding resident snow removal responsibilities is available on the Douglas County website https://www.douglas.co.us/road-work/snow-and-ice-removal/ for your use.

Pinery residents should be aware of the following:

- Any vehicles parked in the roadway, blocking access, will cause the snowplow not to clear that street.
- It is illegal to place any snow and ice from private property (e.g. driveway) onto the street or public right-of-way.

From the Douglas County Website:

Anyone who violates the snow removal policy is committing a class 2 petty offense and if convicted is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$50 per violation. This ordinance is enforced by the Douglas County Sheriff's Office.

## Some Frequently Asked Questions Regarding Snow Removal

#### What if I have an emergency and my street isn't plowed?

If an emergency situation occurs, call 911. Equipment will be diverted for emergencies ONLY WHEN REQUESTED BY AN EMERGENCY SERVICE AGENCY OR THE DOUGLAS COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT. The Sheriff's Department is in constant communication with PW Ops personnel during snow events so snow removal equipment can be detoured to assist emergency services.

#### Who is responsible for damaged mailboxes?

Mailboxes installed along roadways are at the risk of the owner. Mailboxes damaged from lack of owner maintenance, weight of snow from plowing, or vandalism is not the responsibility of the County. Postal regulations require residents to clean snow from in front of mailboxes to allow for mail delivery. Douglas County encourages the clustering of individual mailboxes to minimize potential damage during snow-storms and to increase efficiency of mail delivery. #### After the storm, the snowplow came through and pushed snow back into my driveway entrance.

Cleanup and widening operations often take place one to four days after the snowstorm, depending upon the severity of the storm and wind conditions. It is often necessary to widen roads to ensure that ice and snow melts from the pavement surface. Unfortunately, subsequent widening operations may push snow back onto sidewalks and driveways.

#### FireWise 2023 and Beyond

2023 proved to be quite a busy year for our FireWise Program! Our Pinery residents did a wonderful job of taking advantage of the Chipper Days Event, and the fire mitigation log expressed how hard you all worked this year!

We had 88 entries for the 2023 reporting season. This amounted to 1527 hours worked and \$36K+ logged as spent by our homeowners alone during their efforts. WOW!! You are all doing incredible work out there! You may be eligible to claim your expenses on your taxes using the guidelines from the "Income 65" form. We have put this on our Firewise Community page under the Resident Resources tab.

In the office and within the Fire Mitigation Committee, we were responsible for renewing the Risk Assessment for The Pinery HOA this year. This was the first time renewing this plan since the start of The Pinery's journey to becoming "FireWise" in 2016.

Thankfully, the original plan was pulled together and written by South Metro Fire Rescue's Einar Jensen, so it provided us with a lot of information to add and update to. Since the original plan was created, there have been many homes built and more street routes available to use in the event of an emergency evacuation. Detailed information regarding how much acreage the Pinery owns within our parks and open spaces, as well as all the work the CSC has contracted to be done in effort to mitigating these spaces have also been added into this new plan. It has opened our eyes to projects needing to be done over the next few years within the community. When this plan is finalized, it will be available to view on our website on the Firewise Community Page.

Suffice it to say, a lot of work has been done over the last several years, not only within our committees, but also within our community, from you, our neighbors! I want to express my gratitude to our small Fire Mitigation Committee for the enormous efforts put forth on this plan.

To wrap last year up and in bright hopes for the 2024 year, if you are interested in this type of data crunching, safety preparedness planning, and serving your community, please reach out to join the Fire Mitigation Committee.
