Douglas County Household Chemical Roundups 9 a.m.—3 p.m.

Open to residents of Douglas County

Acceptable Items: paint and paint products, automotive fluids, fuels, vehicle and household batteries. house, garden and pool chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, CFLs, items containing mercury, propane tanks (1-20 lbs.), and passenger vehicle pickup truck tires (remove from rim).

Unacceptable Items: business and commercial waste, radioactive waste, electronic waste, explosive waste, smoke detectors, waste containing asbestos, tractor tires, scrap metal.

You will need: a driver's license, water bill, utility bill or phone bill as proof of residency.

Cost: A payment of \$25 is requested to help offset the high cost of hazardous waste disposal.

Paint: Although leftover latex paint will be accepted at the Roundups, water-based latex paint can be safely and legally disposed of in regular household garbage if it is completely dried out. Mixing the paint with kitty litter, sand, dirt or concrete-mix will help speed the drying process. Leave the lids off of all paint cans so that waste haulers can see that the paint can is empty or that the paint is completely dry.

Slash/Mulch Site Open to Minimize Fire Hazards— Saturdays ONLY through September 10th 8 a.m. through 1 p.m.

To help residents clear their properties of dead tree branches and shrubbery, a slash/mulch site will be open through September 10. The site will be open from 8 a.m. and 1 p.m., Saturdays only and is located at 1400 Caprice Dr. in Castle Rock. If raining please call 303.663.6274 to confirm the site is open.

Acceptable items are tree branches and shrubbery with a maximum length of 6 ft. and maximum diameter of 12 inches. All loads when brought in must be covered and tied down. Stumps, roots, lumber, ties, grass, dirt, household trash, appliances and weeds are NOT accepted.

The County respectfully requests that residents DO NOT leave materials anywhere on the site when it is closed/unattended.

Douglas County and the Wildfire Mitigation Specialists encourage property owners to use this opportunity to perform mitigation work and reduce hazardous fuels on their land. 

YOUR OPINION MATTERS: FRONT ENTRANCE SIGN REPLACEMENT

n the 2011 approved budget, funds were set aside to replace and update the front entrance and community board signs. The physical signs are quite old and must be replaced due to structural, electrical and maintenance issues. The Pinery **HOA Community Services** Committee (CSC), the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) and the Executive Board request your input by voting on the North Pinery Parkway entrance sign final designs. Over the past 18 months, we have solicited designs from several companies and all committees and the Executive Board have reviewed the submissions and agreed to have the community weigh in on options. We have achieved the goal of incorporating the rock monument into the design of a rustic, yet more modern sign.

Mockup # 1 shows a new sign utilizing the existing curled font from previous years.

Mockup # 2 shows a new sign updating the font to the current logo the Pinery uses in all other forms of communication.

Both signs will be backlit, as it is today, and contain all pertinent information regarding covenant controls.

Your **Community Services Committee is presenting Mockup #2** in an effort to attain a consistent logo brand that

distinguishes The Pinery development through all forms of communications with residents, appearance to prospective buyers and the community. In choosing Mockup #2, all entrance signs will have a common appearance and show standardization across the Front Entrance, Map and Community Information signs.

Notes: The current Community Information Sign and the Pinery Map Sign utilizes the logo in Mockup # 2. This logo is displayed throughout the newsletter. The Community Information Sign is being replaced with a lighted sign and the map sign will have new lighting for better display.

In Support of Maintaining the Current Entry Sign...

The current Pinery entrance sign design (see photo on right) is most assuredly not new. I don't know exactly when it was installed but I know that it has been here at least since 1989 when we bought our house.

Based on information in the HOA files, the lettering design is the logo first used by the initial Pinery developer, Terracor. A plat for Filing 1 of the Pinery, dated May of 1970, uses the design and it is commonly found in early Pinery files. Since that time, letterhead has borne two additional logos; one of which is currently in use today and is part of the proposal for changing the sign.

Our neighborhood character was established by the foresight of our founders. Our front door sets us apart from neighboring developments, created over the last two decades. Many times, when a new resident greets us for the first time, they say that what drew them to the Pinery was its neighborhood feel, unlike anything in the newer developments. I like to think that our "not 21st century" entryway sign is a part of that.

Aside from the historical benefits of the design, the rounded nature of the original logo design complements the rounded wall monument on which it sits nicely.

Maintained historical structures in our corner of Douglas County are very few. Although our history is more recent than say, a century-old farmhouse, I feel it is important to cherish and maintain elements which add to the whole story of our history.

This community has made a commitment to honoring our past by including a history center in the Pinery Nature Park. To further honor the character and history of the Pinery, please consider appropriate maintenance and restoration of the current sign, rather than replacing it with a newer logo.

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PHA Trash Program Enrollment Form

If you are not in the Pinery Trash Program, you might want to consider joining with the over 1500 other participating homeowners. The program offers state of the art trash service including Single Stream Recycling. This provides you, with the opportunity to put paper and other recyclables together into a labeled container (we provide the labels) of your choice. Recycling must be separated from your regular household trash, but the recycling center now separates the paper from the bottles, cans, etc. You may choose to use a container with wheels and a lid for ease of handling.

In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.

Pinery Loop Trail Dedicated May 7, 2011.

n Saturday May 7, Douglas County dedicated the Pinery Loop Trail. Many Pinery residents turned out and walked the four-mile trail around the Pinery.

The trail connects pedestrian and non-motorized vehicles in the lower Pinery with the Cherry Creek Regional Trail, Kinney Creek Trail (within the Colorado Golf Club), the Pinery Park, Bingham Lake, Northeast Elementary and Mountain View Elementary (see map).

At the request of the PHA, in 2007, Douglas County applied for GOCO (Great Outdoors Colorado lottery funds) and was awarded a grant in

2008 for over \$100,000, which catalyzed the trail's construction, which was scheduled and completed in the last quarter of 2010.

In addition to the GOCO grant, Douglas County contributed over \$200,000 in materials and labor and the PHA contributed \$62,000 from contributions in three different fiscal years. Douglas County managed the construction and is responsible for the trail's maintenance.

DC Parks and Trails (Ron Benson, Randy Burkhardt, Paul Whalen), along with DC roads and bridges (Randy Teague), engineering, traffic, and other DC departments cooperated with the

PHA on the final design and construction. Road and bridges will maintain the trail. Douglas County was very careful to respect Pinery residential property and the Pinery Country Club's property. Douglas County worked very cooperatively with the PHA and deserves our appreciation for a job very well done on this amenity that will improve our quality of life and the value of our homes.



A Lion in the Pinery?

Reaction from a Wildlife Professional and Pinery Neighbor

ow do you react to this information? A lion in the Pinery? Most of us don't have a ready made plan for how to react. It isn't something that most people prepare for. It seems like information that requires a strong emotional response. And we should probably DO something... but what?

The 5:00 a.m. photo of a mountain lion in a backyard on Windlawn Way is pretty compelling evidence that a lion has at least visited our community and may still be nearby. If you are having mixed reaction and don't really know how to feel about this, join the club.

I am recently retired from 40 years as a wildlife professional, most of that time with the Colorado Division of Wildlife. The last time I saw a mountain lion I was peering through the sites of a tranquilizer gun. The lion had made its way into Denver and was freaking out a lot of people. Even with significant experience with lions and other predators, my emotional response is also mixed.

Mountain Lions and Deer

I've lived in The Pinery for 23 years. We have always had a lot of deer but perhaps never more than now. I, for one, enjoy the deer and like having them around. I am willing to trade the loss of my tulips and most of my other flowers for the pleasure of waking up to find a doe and her fawn bedded down under my pine trees. However, the deer population in our neighborhood has likely exceeded the carrying capacity of the natural food. They are starting to eat plants that used to be left alone like small pines and aspen bark.

Mountain lions are attracted to areas with large deer populations. Over 90% of their diet is deer. With such a healthy population of deer in the Pinery, We do see mountain lions from time to time. So what do we do about it?

Mountain lion attacks on people are very rare. In Colorado there have been only two fatal lion attacks on people. The first ever recorded was in Idaho Springs in 1991. The other was in Rocky Mountain National Park in 1997. That's it! We have thousands of lions in Colorado with thousands of encounters. Even if the lion is still here, an attack is very unlikely.

There have been reports of mountain lions every year to the PHA office. They usually don't stay long, maybe a week or two before moving on. They are <u>amazingly</u> illusive. Seeing a lion is such a rare experience, when it happens it will affect you to the core.

Reaction

So, what is my reaction? I will roam my neighborhood with a heightened sense of awareness, and perhaps a bit of caution. I will not walk alone at dusk, especially in the undeveloped wooded areas. And I might even carry a hefty stick when I walk. I will also discourage people from letting their small children play in the yard unsupervised in the evening hours.

I also react with a sense of awe. Mountain lions are the supreme predator in North America. Having one choose to visit my neighborhood speaks to the wildness of where I live. Mountain Lion Awareness

When Mountain Lions Meet People

Generally, lions are calm, quiet, and elusive. They tend to live in remote, primitive country. Lions are most commonly found in areas with plentiful deer and adequate cover. Such conditions exist in mountain subdivisions, urban fringes, and open spaces. Consequently, the number of mountain lion/human interactions has increased. This increase is likely due to a variety of reasons: more people moving into lion habitat, increase in deer populations and density, presumed increase in lion numbers and expanded range, more people using hiking and running trails in lion habitat and a greater awareness of the presence of lions.

What to do if you live in lion country

To reduce the risk of problems with mountain lions on or near your property, we urge you follow these simple precautions:

- *Make lots of noise* if you come and go during times mountain lions are most active—dusk to dawn
- Install outside lighting. Light areas where you walk so you could see a lion if one were present. Closely supervise children whenever they play out-

- doors. Make sure children are inside before dusk and not outside before dawn. Talk with children about lions and teach them what to do if they meet one.
- Landscape or remove vegetation to *eliminate hiding* places for lions, especially around children's play areas. Make it difficult for lions to approach unseen.
- Planting non-native shrubs and plants that deer often prefer to eat encourages wildlife to come onto your

- property. Predators follow prey. Feeding the wildlife is dangerous and illegal!
- Keep your pet under control. Roaming pets are easy prey and can attract lions. Bring pets in at night. If you leave your pet outside, keep it in a kennel with a secure top. Don't feed pets outside; this can attract raccoons and other animals that are eaten by lions. Store all garbage securely.

Who do you call?

The Colorado Division of Wildlife is responsible for managing, conserving, and protecting wildlife.

If you have an encounter with a lion, immediately contact the Division of Wildlife, Monday—Friday, 8 a.m.—5 p.m.—303-291-7227. After hours, contact the Colorado State Patrol or Sheriff's department.

To report a sighting, please contact the Division during normal business hours. Your information is very valuable.
