

Douglas County Household Chemical Roundups 9 a.m.—3 p.m.

Open to residents of Douglas County

Acceptable Items: paint and paint products, automotive fluids, fuels, vehicle and household batteries, house, garden and pool chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, CFLs, items containing mercury, propane tanks (1-20 lbs.), and passenger vehicle pickup truck tires (remove from rim).

<u>Unacceptable Items</u>: business and commercial waste, radioactive waste, electronic waste, explosive waste, smoke detectors, waste containing asbestos, tractor tires, scrap metal.

You will need: a driver's license, water bill, utility bill or phone bill as proof of residency.

<u>**Cost</u>**: A payment of \$25 is requested to help offset the high cost of hazardous waste disposal.</u> Paint: Although leftover latex paint will be accepted at the Roundups, water-based latex paint can be safely and legally disposed of in regular household garbage if it is completely dried out. Mixing the paint with kitty litter, sand, dirt or concrete-mix will help speed the drying process. Leave the lids off of all paint cans so that waste haulers can see that the paint can is empty or that the paint is completely dry.



Suggestions from Douglas County Sheriff Dave Weaver following the Burning Tree Fire

Wow! Can anyone believe that we are in the middle of one of the worst fire danger periods since 2002 (Hayman Fire year)? AND IT IS ONLY MAY! The Burning Tree fire last month is an example of how the combination of ultra-dry conditions, low humidity, and strong winds can whip a small grass fire into a 1600 acre inferno in just a couple of hours. The fast moving characteristics of that fire resulted in the evacuation of 8500 homes in Burning Tree, The Pinery and other nearby subdivisions.

Register for the Emergency Mass Notification System

If you are a county resident please register for the Emergency Mass Notification System. The Douglas County Sheriff's Office alerts residents about fires, floods, toxic environmental issues and other emergencies using Everbridge Aware(tm) mass notification system. Messages can be sent to residents on - cell phone, home phone, email, text messaging, pager, PDA and more - ensuring that individuals who live and

work in the county receive lifesaving emergency information and important public service announcements. Any Qwest home phone listed in the county's 9-1-1 database is automatically subscribed to alerts by phone. If your home phone service is any provider other than Qwest, you will need to contact your phone provider to determine if you have been registered. If you are not registered please go to the link below to register. It is suggested that all persons who live and/or work in Douglas County register

and provide additional contact information such as cell phones, text messaging, home and work email, etc. (If you work at a location that has a large phone system or PBX type system, do not register your work line). Be sure to include all forms of communication devices for all residents at your address, including children.

Creating a Grab and Go Box

What do you take with you?

First, get yourself a large photo organizer box or something similar to create your 'grab and go' box. Make sure it's a size you'll be able to easily carry. You may want to get one for each family member. This will become your 'grab and go' box in case of emergency.

Must Have Items:

Medications - During the recent evacuation of the Pinery several residents took valuable time to go back in their houses to retrieve needed medications. Your 'grab and go' box should include at least a <u>two day supply</u> of medications for each family member.

Important papers – Have copies of at least the first page containing your account number and contact information for each of the following:

- Homeowners' or renters' insurance policy
- Social security card(s)
- ID Information Drivers License, Passports, Birth Certificates

- Life Insurance Policies
- Credit Card Statements
- Professional Licenses
- Medical Records

Personalize your emergency grab and go box to include all paperwork or information that is important to you and your family. Store grab and go box in a handy area. Lastly, if you choose to have a second box, use it for many of your photos/ memory books.

The Pinery and Shred-It (NAID-certified, one of the largest shredding companies in the world, and listed on the State of Colorado preferred vendor list) will partner in a commitment to the prevention of identity theft. The Community Services Committee is proud to offer this service for the PHA members (in good standing). Those who are Pinery residents and are not active PHA members in good standing, may update their membership by contacting the PHA office prior to the event or may join on-site.

Each household is welcome to bring up to 3 copy paper boxes or one trash bag full of confidential material: old bank statements, credit card offers, cancelled checks, old medical records, pay check stubs, and/or anything with your personal information.

<u>Unacceptable items</u>: trash...pop cans...newspapers

All the paper will be shredded on-site in the truck, then taken to Shred-It's facility in Denver. The paper will then baled and loaded onto a trailer where it will be taken to a recycling plant. All paper will stay in the U.S.A. and will come back in the form of paper plates, paper towels, and paper napkins.

<u>Volunteers Needed</u> – 4 to 6 people are needed for check in of residents...unloading boxes and breaking down boxes. (Depending on the number of volunteers, one hour shifts may be created.)

PHA Trash Program Enrollment Form

If you are not in the Pinery Trash Program, you might want to consider joining with the over 1500 other participating homeowners. The program offers state of the art trash service including Single Stream Recycling. This provides you, with the opportunity to put paper and other recyclables together into a labeled container (we provide the labels) of your choice. Recycling must be separated from your regular household trash, but the recycling center now separates the paper from the bottles, cans, etc. You may choose to use a container with wheels and a lid for ease of handling. In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.



The 2011 Reappraisal and Notices of Valuation Teri Cox, Douglas County Assessor

As a result of the 2011 reappraisal, on May 1 the Assessor's Office will mail each property owner a notice of the appraised value of their property, with some important differences from past notifications. This year, in order to reduce the cost of mailing valuation information to property owners, the Assessor's Office will mail postcards instead of long notices. The long Notice of Value for 2011 will still be available on the Assessor's web-

site as a tab on your property's Parcel Detail page.

Every two years the assessor's office revalues all real estate in the county as of an appraisal date set by state law. This year the date is June 30, 2010. Every reappraisal, we disregard the old valuations and start from scratch using an entirely new sales list. In other words, we aren't allowed to adjust values up or down by a percentage, but instead have to analyze sales from a specific time frame –in the case of the 2011 reappraisal this was from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2010. We cannot consider sales or market influences that occurred after June 30, 2010.
