Douglas County Household Chemical Roundups 9 a.m.—3 p.m.

Open to residents of Douglas County

Acceptable Items: paint and paint products, automotive fluids, fuels, vehicle and household batteries, house, garden and pool chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, CFLs, items containing mercury, propane tanks (1-20 lbs.), and passenger vehicle pickup truck tires (remove from rim).

<u>Unacceptable Items</u>: business and commercial waste, radioactive waste, electronic waste, explosive waste, smoke detectors, waste containing asbestos, tractor tires, scrap metal.

You will need: a driver's license, water bill, utility bill or phone bill as proof of residency.

<u>Cost</u>: A payment of \$25 is requested to help offset the high cost of hazardous waste disposal.

Paint: Although leftover latex paint will be accepted at the Roundups, water-based latex paint can be safely and legally disposed of in regular household garbage if it is completely dried out. Mixing the paint with kitty litter, sand, dirt or concrete-mix will help speed the drying process. Leave the lids off of all paint cans so that waste haulers can see that the paint can is empty or that the paint is completely dry.





Slash/Mulch Site Open to Minimize Fire Hazards— Saturdays ONLY through September 10th 8 a.m. through 1 p.m.

To help residents clear their properties of dead tree branches and shrubbery, a slash/mulch site will be open through September 10. The site will be open from 8 a.m. and 1 p.m., Saturdays only and is located at 1400 Caprice Dr. in Castle Rock. If raining please call 303.663.6274 to confirm the site is open.

Acceptable items are tree branches and shrubbery with a maximum length of 6 ft. and maximum diameter of 12 inches. All loads when brought in must be covered and tied down. Stumps, roots, lumber, ties, grass, dirt, household trash, appliances and weeds are NOT accepted.

The County respectfully requests that residents DO NOT leave materials anywhere on the site when it is closed/unattended.

Douglas County and the Wildfire Mitigation Specialists encourage property owners to use this opportunity to perform mitigation work and reduce hazardous fuels on their land. By submitting this enrollment form with initial payment, the above Pinery resident and/or homeowner ("Homeowner") hereby authorizes The Pinery Homeowners' Association, Inc. ("PHA") to engage its contracted trash service to collect and dispose of Homeowner's normal household waste materials at the above described Pinery residence. Homeowner warrants that all waste materials offered for collection will not contain any hazardous, toxic or radioactive wastes or substances as defined by applicable federal, state or local laws or regulations. Homeowner agrees to pay PHA in advance within 15 days of billing for trash service at the PHA's then current rates until such time as Homeowner notifies PHA of Homeowner's termination from the PHA trash program. Failure to pay as specified which results in rebilling and/or termination will incur fees to cover the PHA cost of these actions. Homeowner shall be solely responsible to the contracted trash service for any additional services requested which are not included in PHA's normal trash program. Homeowner acknowledges that PHA is merely acting as a billing agent for the contracted trash service. Homeowner acknowledges and agrees that PHA will not be liable for any act or failure to act on the part of the contracted trash service, including, without limitation, violation of laws or regulations, injury or death to persons or animals and loss or damage to property or the environment.

COVENANT CORNER

The Pinery Architectural Review Committee

Fencing

n order to maintain the open space environment characteristic of the Pinery, use of split rail fencing is encouraged where fencing is needed. Where containment of animals or small children is the goal, 2" x4" welded wire may be used on the inside of the fence, not to exceed the top rail, to ground level.

Placement of the fence should be at or within setbacks specified in the "Dwelling, Construction, and Fence Restrictions" in the applicable Pinery Protective Covenants.

Submittal for architectural review should include at minimum:

- Plot plan for property showing:
 - Location of existing dwelling
 - Location of property lines and easements
 - Location of proposed fence
 - Measurements between all of the above
 - Drawing of proposed fence including location and width of gates (48" maximum)
- Description of fence material (e.g. 2-rail split rail with 2" x4" welded wire).

 Signatures of affected neighbors to indicate that they are aware of the proposed change, the meeting date, and time the plan will be presented to the ARC.

In order to facilitate planting of vegetable gardens only, the Architectural Review Committee will allow an exception to the prohibition against wire mesh fencing within the following parameters:

- Work with adjacent neighbors to ensure views are not adversely affected
- Contact the Utility Notification Center of Colorado 1-800-922-1987 for locates before any digging takes place
- Fence to be installed only during the growing season; not installed prior to April 15 / removed no later than October 15. Fence materials stored out of view when not in use
- Materials used should be selected so that the visibility of the fence is minimized:
 - Fence no taller than 6'
 - Use 2" x4" welded wire
 - Narrow posts, also no taller than 6', such as the 6' studded T-post available for utility fences.

Pinery Signage Policy

estate signage to one small sign per property. Pinery policy is that signs may not be posted off of the property. Therefore, directional signs posted on an ongoing basis are prohibited.

For an open house or garage sale, one directional sign, present for one day only at a nearby intersection, and removed at night, is allowed. Signs not meeting this policy will be removed and brought to the PHA office.

Signs should not remain after the sale. Leftover signage is increasingly present and detracts from the neighborhood. Don't rely on your neighbors or the HOA to remove these signs. If you put it up, take it down!

State legislation requires that covenants may be no more restrictive than local (Douglas County) regulations with regard to political signage; therefore, political signage falls under the county zoning regulations.

All other signage is prohibited by virtue of Pinery Protective Covenants.
