

Slash/Mulch Site Open to Minimize Fire Hazards Saturdays ONLY through September 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.

This is a great opportunity to help in cleanup after the hailstorm and for fire mitigation in this dry season.

The Slash/Mulch site helps residents minimize fire hazards by providing a location to dispose of dead tree branches and shrubbery that have been cleared from personal property. Douglas County operates the slash/mulch site on Saturdays from Memorial Day through Labor Day each year.

Acceptable items are tree branches and shrubbery with a maximum length of 6 ft. and maximum diameter of 12 inches. All loads when brought in must be covered and tied down. Stumps, roots, lumber, railroad ties, grass, dirt, household trash, loose pine needles, appliances and weeds are NOT accepted.

In case of inclement weather, please call <u>303-663-6274</u> to ensure that the slash/mulch site will be operational.

Douglas County and the Wildfire Mitigation Specialists encourage property owners to use this opportunity to perform mitigation work and reduce hazardous fuels on their land. Douglas County Wildfire Mitigation Specialists offer free site visits to determine the safety of a property at no cost, upon request. Douglas County Household Chemical Roundups 9 a.m.—3 p.m.

Open to residents of Douglas County

Acceptable Items: House and garden chemicals, Automotive fluids, Fluorescent light bulbs and CFLs, Fuels, Propane tanks (1-20 lbs.), Vehicle and household batteries, Items containing mercury, Car and pickup truck tires, off rim, Oil-based paint and paint products.

<u>Unacceptable Items</u>: Business and commercial wastes, Radioactive waste, Electronic waste (Computers, TVs, etc), Explosive waste, Smoke detectors, Waste containing asbestos, Compressed gasses other than propane, Tractor tires, Scrap metal and Medical waste.

You will need: a driver's license, water bill, utility bill or phone bill as proof of residency.

<u>Cost</u>: A payment of \$25 is requested to help offset the high cost of hazardous waste disposal.

Paint: Although leftover latex paint will be accepted at the Roundups, water-based latex paint can be safely and legally disposed of in regular household garbage if it is completely dried out. Mixing the paint with kitty litter, sand, dirt or concrete-mix will help speed the drying process. Leave the lids off of all paint cans so that waste haulers can see that the paint can is empty or that the paint is completely dry.

Recycling must be separated from your regular household trash, but the recycling cen-

In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.

By submitting this enrollment form with initial payment, the above Pinery resident and/or homeowner ("Homeowner") hereby authorizes The Pinery Homeowners' Association, Inc. ("PHA") to engage its contracted trash service to collect and dispose of Homeowner's normal household waste materials at the above described Pinery residence. Homeowner warrants that all waste materials offered for collection will not contain any hazardous, toxic or radioactive wastes or substances as defined by applicable federal, state or local laws or regulations. Homeowner agrees to pay PHA in advance within 15 days of billing for trash service at the PHA's then current rates until such time as Homeowner notifies PHA of Homeowner's termination from the PHA trash program. Failure to pay as specified which results in rebilling and/or termination will incur fees to cover the PHA cost of these actions. Homeowner shall be solely responsible to the contracted trash service for any additional services requested which are not included in PHA's normal trash program. Homeowner acknowledges and agrees: 1) that PHA is merely acting as a billing agent for the contracted trash service; 2) that Homeowner shall not receive any refund upon termination of Homeowner's participation in PHA trash program unless Homeowner provides advance notice to PHA, including address to which refund should be sent; and 3) that PHA will not be liable for any act or failure to act on the part of the contracted trash service, including, without limitation, violation of laws or regulations, injury or death to persons or animals and loss or damage to property or the environment.
