<u>Please note</u>: you must be a 2015 PHA member in good standing (dues current) within Pinery filings 1-8A to vote or run for a positon in the January election.



#### Working Together to Prevent Damage From Wildfires

The Pinery ecosystem was generated by wildfire. Historically, low- and moderate-intensity wildfires burned through this area, recycling nutrients into the soil and reducing competition for resources such as water, nutrients, sunlight and space. Those wildfires created habitat for the towering ponderosa pines, Gambel

oak, mountain mahogany and other plant species that make your neighborhoods so wonderful.

In fact the Black Forest as a whole is a product of wildfire.

The Pinery has changed in the last few decades. It remains an ecosystem borne of wildfire, but now the native vegetation shares space with exotic species and piles of fuel we usually call homes, schools and infrastructure.

Preventing wildfires in such a vibrant ecosystem is silly. A better goal – and one that South Metro Fire Rescue Authority has adopted – is preventing them from destroying property and injuring people. But we can't do that alone; all of us need to work together and share the responsibility to protect our community.

The risk of wildfire is debatable. A fire hasn't burned in The Pinery for decades, but a fire almost burned through here in March 2012. Had the wind not shifted that afternoon, the Burning Tree Fire may have burned all the way to E470. Firefighters can do little to contain a fire driven by 60-mph winds. While that fire didn't affect The Pinery directly (beyond causing an evacuation), this neighborhood remains vulnerable to wildfire. The big one could ignite at any time.

Thus, today is a great day to reduce our collective vulnerability, even if you disagree with us about the risk of a wildfire.

Let's make 2015 a year of safety for our families. We challenge you to do five things between now and March to improve the safety of your loved ones and the ability of your property to resist a wildfire.

- 1. Contact us at 720-989-2273 or <u>LifeSafetyEducation@southmetro.org</u> to schedule a home ignition zone assessment. A life safety educator or mitigation specialist will walk your property with you and discuss ways to make your property more resilient. This free service takes 30 minutes usually.
- 2. Register for CodeRed, Douglas County's reverse notification system. Visit <u>www.dcsheriff.net</u> to register.
- 3. Create a family evacuation plan. Remember that Burning Tree Fire? It occurred during Spring Break when many kids were home alone and unable to leave without assistance. We can help you build those plans.
- 4. Make sure your pets have proper and updated identification. They may get separated from you during a stressful evacuation. Proper identification can help ensure prompt reunification.
- 5. Take the following survey to help us understand your neighborhood better as we consider strategies for improving your safety: <u>https://www.surveymonkey.ccom/s/Q962S62</u>. As I said above, we share the responsibility for safety.

#### **Snow Removal Information**

#### **Snow Removal – Resident Responsibilities**

Detailed information regarding resident snow removal responsibilities is available on the Douglas County website for your use.

Pinery residents should be aware of the following:

- Any vehicles parked in the roadway, blocking access, will cause the snowplow not to clear that street. Note that streetside overnight parking is also a violation of Pinery Protective Covenants.
- It is illegal to place any snow and ice from private property (e.g. driveway) onto the street or public right-of-way.

#### From the Douglas County Website:

Anyone who violates the snow removal policy is committing a class 2 petty offense and if convicted is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$50 per violation. This ordinance is enforced by the Douglas County Sheriff's Office.

#### **County Responsibility - Snow Removal from County Roads:**

Douglas County works to make roads safer for residents by managing the County in five districts with assigned snowplows and operators for each. Snow removal is prioritized in the following order for all districts:

- 1) arterial roads that are major roadways with high traffic volumes;
- 2) collector roadways that distribute traffic between arterial and local roads, and school routes;
- 3) local roadways; and
- 4) cul-de-sacs.

These roads equate to a total of approximately 2,400 lane miles that Douglas County is responsible for maintaining.

#### **Pinery Teens**

Occasionally the PHA office receives calls from residents asking about snow removal. They would prefer to hire a local young person than a snow removal company to shovel off their porch and driveway. If you are interested in helping in this way, and would like to be put on our teen resource list, please contact the PHA office at 303-841-8572.

#### RV Storage Lot and Snow Removal

The Pinery Storage Facility Lease (Page 2, paragraph 5) states that the Association does not do removal of snow. In addition to being very costly, plowing snow at the lots would be problematic. The soft surfaces at the lot could be easily damaged and, snow would of necessity be plowed in front of spaces of lessees.

Be sure to be aware of this as you make plans for use of your stored vehicle (s).

This means removing all lights, tinsel, garland, plastic wrap, tree stands, wire, rope, nails and all other foreign materials from trees before recycling them. Live trees with artificial snow sprayed on the branches cannot be mulched.

Waste Management can pick it up with your regular trash if it is no taller than 5' or cut in half. In this case, it would not be recycled.





### PHA Trash Program Enrollment Form

If you are not in the Pinery Trash Program, you might want to consider joining with the over 1500 other participating homeowners. The program offers state of the art trash service including Single Stream Recycling. This provides you, with the opportunity to put paper and other recyclables together into a labeled container (we provide the labels) of your choice. Recycling must be separated from your regular household trash, but the recycling center now separates the paper from the bottles, cans, etc. You may choose to use a container with wheels and a lid for ease of handling. In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.

All trash starts must be received in the PHA office no later than 1 p.m. on the Thursday prior to the desired Monday service day.

#### AGREEMENT

By submitting this enrollment form with initial payment, the above Pinery resident and/or homeowner ("Homeowner") hereby authorizes The Pinery Homeowners' Association, Inc. ("PHA") to engage its contracted trash service to collect and dispose of Homeowner's normal household waste materials at the above described Pinery residence. Homeowner warrants that all waste materials offered for collection will not contain any hazardous, toxic or radioactive wastes or substances as defined by applicable federal, state or local laws or regulations. Homeowner agrees to pay PHA in advance within 15 days of billing for trash service at the PHA's then current rates until such time as Homeowner notifies PHA of Homeowner's termination from the PHA trash program. Failure to pay as specified which results in rebilling and/or termination will incur fees to cover the PHA cost of these actions. Homeowner shall be solely responsible to the contracted trash service for any additional services requested which are not included in PHA's normal trash program. Homeowner acknowledges and agrees: 1) that PHA is merely acting as a billing agent for the contracted trash service; 2) that Homeowner shall not receive any refund upon termination of Homeowner's participation in PHA trash program unless Homeowner provides advance notice to PHA, including address to which refund should be sent; and 3) that PHA will not be liable for any act or failure to act on the part of the contracted trash service, including, without limitation, violation of laws or regulations, injury or death to persons or animals and loss or damage to property or the environment.






