Every day is a great day to prepare for wildfire, but it can be difficult to stay motivated when you're the only one trimming or raking. Because risk reduction is more meaningful when we combine efforts, South Metro Fire Rescue invites our neighbors in The Pinery to participate in Wildfire Community Preparedness Day on May 7.

The National Fire Protection Association and Fire Adapted Communities created Wildfire Community Preparedness Day. It's the perfect time to spend a few hours working together as a family or with neighbors to prune vegetation, clean gutters, rake dead leaves and needles, and create your family's neighborhood evacuation plan.

Your actions will help reduce your community's wildfire risk and improve your family's safety. Your actions will improve the safety for our family of emergency responders, too.

Challenge your friends, your family, relatives, faith-based group or youth organization to develop a project and join others throughout the nation in making big changes. In advance of May 7, contact SMFR for a free home wildfire assessment at ReducingRisk@southmetro.org.

Additionally, SMFR and The Pinery Homeowners Association partnered to create a neighborhood mitigation plan. Members of the wildfire mitigation committee are developing a list of projects to reduce the wildfire risk in the community.

Douglas County's public safety agencies encourage everyone to register their contact information in the CodeRED system (reverse 911). Registration is not automatic, but it may be critical to your safety and that of your family.



The Year of the Pollinators - Saving Monarch Butterflies

You may not have noticed but many people are promoting the support for pollinators in the garden. What are pollinators? Pollinators are bees, moths, flies, birds and butterflies or other animals that move pollen from flower to flower. Pollinators are important for a successful garden and the creation of food. Pollinators help in the production of: apples, blueberries, chocolate, coffee, melon, peaches, vanilla and tequila. The last few years have seen a decline in pollinators so there is a major movement to increase their populations. We are going to focus on one particular pollinator - monarch butterflies.





going from flower to flower. In recent years, the number of monarchs has dwindled which has been attributed to loss of habitat (mainly in Mexico) and the use of pesticides. Another factor is a decrease in a good food source - milkweed (*Asclepias spp*).

For many years, milkweed flourished in the Midwest throughout cornfields and along roadsides. As the desire for corn and soy escalated, milkweed was deemed a noxious weed and has been eradicated from farmlands. As farmers wanted to improve the amount of crops produced, chemists invented **Monsanto's Roundup** and genetically modified crops. While the crops were created to withstand the treatment of Roundup the noxious weeds died off. No big deal, right? Well this has become a very big deal for the monarchs as milkweed is the **ONLY** plant that the larvae (caterpillars) will eat.

Monarchs migrate to Mexico every year for the winter months. As they travel north for the summer, they use milkweed as rest stops along the way. According to Shalene Hiller, horticulturist for the City of Westminster, Colorado, "they need as much help in as many spots as they can get ²." As such, the City of Westminster and the Butterfly Pavilion are planting butterfly friendly gardens throughout the city with a focus on milkweed. Not only is milkweed a big food source for the monarchs, but it also produces a chemical that the larvae eat which makes the larvae and adults poisonous to their predators.

Buy the right milkweed. Not all milkweed is the same. Do not plant the tropical version of milkweed. Monarchs that live off the tropical species become infected with a protozoan parasite which causes them to die quicker.

One of my favorite garden catalogs - High Country Gardens - sells several varieties of milkweed as plants and seeds (http://www.highcountrygardens.com). Milkweed produces pink and orange flowers. Some varieties do well in dry climates which are perfect for our area. Also, you can check our local garden centers for milkweed plants as well.

(The Year of the Pollinators cont'd)

Key components of garden habitat for monarchs3:

Gardens should be planted in sunny spots, with some protection from the wind.

At least one milkweed species that is native to the area will provide food for monarch caterpillars.

A variety of nectar plants with staggered bloom times give butterflies and other pollinators a continuous food source. Include a combination of early, middle and late blooming species to fuel butterfly breeding and migration.

Herbicides and pesticides should be avoided, as they can hurt caterpillars and adults.

FYI - My term as President of the Black Forest Gardeners is coming to an end in June. This will be my last article for the PHA newsletter. It has been fun writing these articles and I hope that you found some useful information from them.

PHA Trash Program Enrollment Form

New form as of January 2016

If you are not in the Pinery Trash Program, you might want to consider joining with the over 1500 other participating homeowners. The program offers state of the art trash service including Single Stream Recycling. This provides you, with the opportunity to put paper and other recyclables together into a labeled container (we provide the labels) of your choice. Recycling must be separated from your regular household trash, but the recycling center now separates the paper from the bottles, cans, etc. You may choose to use a container with wheels and a lid for ease of handling.

In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.

All trash starts must be received in the PHA office no later than 1 p.m. on the Thursday prior to the desired Monday service day.

AGREEMENT

By submitting this enrollment form with initial payment, the above Pinery resident and/or homeowner ("Homeowner") hereby authorizes The Pinery Homeowners' Association, Inc. ("PHA") to engage its contracted trash service to collect and dispose of Homeowner's normal household waste materials at the above described Pinery residence. Homeowner warrants that all waste materials offered for collection will not contain any hazardous, toxic or radioactive wastes or substances as defined by applicable federal, state or local laws or regulations. Homeowner agrees to pay PHA in advance within 15 days of billing for trash service at the PHA's then current rates until such time as Homeowner notifies PHA of Homeowner's termination from the PHA trash program. Failure to pay as specified which results in rebilling and/or termination will incur fees to cover the PHA cost of these actions. Homeowner shall be solely responsible to the contracted trash service for any additional services requested which are not included in PHA's normal trash program. Homeowner acknowledges and agrees:

1) that PHA is merely acting as a billing agent for the contracted trash service; 2) that Homeowner shall not receive any refund upon termination of Homeowner's participation in PHA trash program unless Homeowner provides advance notice to PHA, including address to which refund should be sent; and 3) that PHA will not be liable for any act or failure to act on the part of the contracted trash service, including, without limitation, violation of laws or regulations, injury or death to persons or animals and loss or damage to property or the environment.

Acceptable Items: oil-based paint and paint products, automotive fluids, antifreeze, vehicle and household batteries, house and garden chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, CFLs, fuels, items containing mercury, propane tanks, and car and pickup truck tires (remove from rim).

<u>Unacceptable Items</u>: business and commercial waste, radioactive waste, electronic waste (computers, TVs, etc.), explosive waste, smoke detectors, scrap metal, oil drums, asbestos, medical waste or any compressed gases other than propane.

You will need: a driver's license, water bill, utility bill or phone bill as proof of residency.

<u>Cost</u>: A contribution of \$25 per vehicle is requested to help offset the high cost of hazardous waste disposal.

Latex Paint Disposal Tips:

- Water-based latex paint is <u>NOT</u>

 hazardous waste, and can be safely disposed of with your regular household garbage once it is dried out and no longer liquid.
- Mix the paint with kitty litter, dirt or sand to help it dry out and solidify.
- Break the top layer and stir so that wet paint underneath can dry faster.
- Dried-out cans of paint with the lid off can be discarded in household trash.

o help residents clear their properties of dead tree branches and shrubbery, a slash/mulch site will be open through October 29. The site will be open from 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Saturdays only and is located at 1400 Caprice Dr. in Castle Rock. In case of inclement weather, please call 303.663.6274 to confirm the site is open.

Acceptable items: tree branches and shrubbery with a maximum length of 6 ft. and maximum diameter of 12 inches. All loads when brought in must be covered and tied down.

Not Accepted: stumps, roots, lumber, railroad ties, grass, dirt, household trash, loose pine needles, appliances and weeds.

Free wood chips are available to homeowners for use as mulch. An equipment operator is onsite to load wood chips. Material can be picked up anytime during the season the site is open to accept slash.

The County respectfully requests that residents DO NOT leave materials anywhere on the site when it is closed/unattended.

Douglas County and the Wildfire Mitigation Specialists encourage property owners to use this opportunity to perform mitigation work and reduce hazardous fuels on their land. Douglas County Wildfire Mitigation Specialists offer free site visits to determine the safety of a property at no cost, upon request.
