The Pinery Architectural Review Committee



Trimming Trees and Shrubs along Streets

Recently, the Architectural Review Committee has heard from residents concerned about trees and shrubbery blocking vehicle line-of-sight on streets.

Pinery streets are laid within Douglas County right-of-way which, for most streets in the Pinery is 60' wide. What that means is that some portion of ground between the edge of the asphalt and your front boundary is a part of that right-of-way (usually about 15'). Homeowners are responsible for maintenance of this land, including trimming of trees or shrubs which may be present.

You may not be aware that Covenants for Pinery filings 1-8a also address this maintenance. Following is an excerpt from filing 1, similar language is found in the other filings as well:

14. SIGHT DISTANCE AT INTERSECTIONS: No fence, wall, hedge or shrub planting which obstructs sight lines between two (2) and six (6) feet above the roadways shall be placed or permitted to remain on any corner lot within the triangular area formed by the street property lines and a line connecting them at points twenty-five (25) feet from the intersection of the street lines, or in the case of a rounded property corner from the intersection of the street property lines extended. The same sight line limitations shall apply on any lot within ten (10) feet from the intersection of a street property line with the edge of a driveway or alley pavement. No tree shall be permitted to remain within such distances of such intersections unless the foliage line is maintained at sufficient height to prevent obstruction of said sight lines.

If you have trees or shrubs within these areas, please ensure that they are appropriately trimmed for your safety and that of your neighbors and visitors.

Fire Mitigation in The Pinery

In 2016 the Pinery became certified as a FIREWISE USA Community. This is a national recognition program that helps communities take action and ownership in preparing and protecting their homes against the threat of wildfire. We live in a high-risk wildfire area and need to work together to do all we can to reduce the risk of wildfire destruction to our homes and families.

Some insurance companies are giving a 5% discount on your home insurance premium if you live in a FIREWISE Community.

Again, this year The Pinery sponsored free chipping services to PHA residents. It was very successful with about 45 households participating in Chipper Days. Thanks to those who participated in the Chipper program and other fire mitigation activities this year including property assessments.

Your Fire Mitigation Hours and Expenses are Needed:

To maintain our FIREWISE certification we need to report one volunteer hour per household. For the Pinery, that is 1800 hours. This can be a combination of volunteer hours and expenses for equipment used for fire mitigation or paying someone for fire mitigation work. Some hours and expenses that count are shown below:

Hours:

- Rake and remove pine needles and leaves from the ground and gutters
- Clear debris at the base of combustible fences
- Prune trees and bushes
- Remove dead trees and combustible bushes (Juniper)
- Stack and pile dead wood and other debris for curbside pick-up by chipper or trash company
- Mow native grasses and weeds as needed
- Time attending educational sessions on fire mitigation or meeting with a professional

Expenses

- Purchase, rental or maintenance of power equipment for mitigation
- Contractor expenses to perform risk reduction
- Tool purchase/rental (Loppers, pole saws, weed trimmers, rakes, etc.)
- Home Improvement expenses to reduce impacts from heat and embers: Roof, Deck, Fencing, Gutters, Siding, vents, etc. (Architectural Review Committee approval is needed for exterior changes)

RV Lot Reminders



RV Storage Lot and Snow Removal

The Pinery Storage Facility Lease (Page 2, paragraph 5) states that the Association does not do removal of snow. In addition to being very costly, plowing snow at the lots would be problematic. The soft surfaces at the lot could be easily damaged and, snow would of necessity be plowed in front of spaces of lessees.

Be sure to be aware of this as you make plans for use of your stored vehicle(s).

f you are using the Pinery automatic pay system (ACH) to make trash payments, your final payment of \$67.50 will be taken out of your bank account **December 4, 2019**.

Please be sure to inform the PHA office if your account changes for any reason, or if you wish to discontinue your ACH payment.

RV Dump Station News

B ecause of problems with frozen pipes in the past, the water at the dump station was shut off on November 1 and will be turned back on in the spring. The dump facilities will still be available.

Douglas County Emergency Notification System—CodeRED

Life can change in a moment - make sure you are connected to the CodeRED emergency notification system in Douglas County! The system, CodeRED, is a high-speed telephone emergency notification service allowing public safety agencies the ability to deliver pre-recorded information to targeted areas within the county.

Douglas County's public safety agencies encourage everyone to register their contact information in the CodeRED system (reverse 911). Registration is not automatic, but it may be critical to your safety and that of your family.


In addition, our program includes the removal of one Large or Bulk Item every month. Give Waste Management a call, set the item out with your regular household trash and say goodbye. That's twelve times a year you can get rid of a sofa bed, mattress, chair or other item without additional charges. If you have more than one item in a month low rates are offered.

Overnight Parking

Especially during the winter months, we'd like to remind residents that streetside overnight parking is prohibited by Pinery Protective Covenants. Not only does this keep Pinery views from being cluttered with cars, it also ensures access by snow plows and emergency vehicles.

The following slip can be used as a windshield reminder for vehicles being parked streetside. Additional copies are available in the Pinery office.

Streetside Parking

Overnight, streetside parking is increasingly an issue in the Pinery. In addition to giving the neighborhood a cluttered look, parking streetside is a traffic and pedestrian hazard and makes the job of snowplow drivers and, potentially, emergency vehicles difficult. Also, overnight parking on Pinery streets is a covenant violation in all filings of the Pinery. An excerpt from covenants follows:

OVERNIGHT PARKING: No vehicle of any kind, including but not limited to, automobiles, trucks, buses, tractors, trailers, camping vehicles, boats, boat trailers, snowmobiles, mobile homes, two- and three-wheeled motor vehicles, or other wheeled vehicles shall be permitted to be parked on any public street within the subdivision projects between the hours of 2:00 o'clock A.M. and 6:00 o'clock A.M. of any morning.

Please park regularly-used vehicles properly, in your garage or on your hard-surfaced driveway; make arrangements to store other vehicles off-site. Thank you for helping maintain the beauty and safety of the Pinery

- Bag of Sand, Shovel and Tools
- Short Rubber Hose for Siphoning
- Sundry Kit, Paper, Pencil, Map, Tissues, Premoistened Towels,
