# Spring is here - look for changes in the Pinery!




## **North Park**

Pinery North Park at Sunridge Hollow Rd. and Ponderosa Way has had a major upgrade. Trails within the park had deteriorated due to age and erosion, which caused damage to the trails and the parking area. The PHA contracted with a professional engineering design firm for a creative and functional design to correct the erosion. The design implementation has been completed, providing Pinery homeowners with a low maintenance, attractive and functional trail system within the park.

# **Front Entry**

You will also see big changes at our front entry! We have a plan and project ready to go that will bring our entry up to current standards of 2020! Look for new Xeric landscaping, including new water wise

plantings, reduction of thirsty turf, replacement of the 40-year old irrigation system with water efficient technology of today. New LED street lighting will be located along the both sides of North Pinery Parkway. The medians will have low ambient bollard lighting for a soft glow. The current monument will have additional stonework to frame a new Pinery front entry sign.

# Douglas County Emergency Notification System—CodeRED

Life can change in a moment - make sure you are connected to the CodeRED emergency notification system in Douglas County! The system, CodeRED, is a high-speed telephone emergency notification service allowing public safety agencies the ability to deliver pre-recorded information to targeted areas within the county.

Douglas County's public safety agencies encourage everyone to register their contact information in the CodeRED system (reverse 911). Registration is not automatic, but it may be critical to your safety and that of your family.

Is Your House Number Clearly Visible?

Please make sure that your house number is placed on your home as well as on your mailbox. The numbers need to be large enough to be easily read from the street and in a color that can be clearly seen.

- Emergency vehicles need to be able to easily find your home
- Those delivering packages look for numbers on houses

# Recycle Right in 2020



When something is recycled properly, it replaces the use of natural resources to make new consumer goods. We can make a big difference when we choose to recycle right.

At least 30 percent of all the waste we produce is recyclable: metal cans, plastic bottles and jugs, glass jars, clean paper and cardboard. Focus on getting these items, clean and dry, into your bin. Each material goes through its own recycling process to become a manufacturing feedstock. Plastic bottles can become a new shirt and aluminum cans are turned into new cans.

#### Here are some tips to help you recycle right and make a difference at home:

**TIP 1:** Recycle plastics by their shape. Recycle empty plastic bottles and jugs. The recycling symbol (chasing arrows) doesn't guarantee recyclability.

Empty all food or liquids before recycling the container.

**TIP 2:** Recycle all your clean paper and cardboard. This includes newspaper, office paper, and magazines.

Flatten cardboard boxes to leave more room in your recycling bin and make the sorting process easier.

**TIP 3:** Do not bag recyclables. Empty them loose in the cart. Plastic bags get tangled in sorting equipment at the recycling facility and can bring operations to a halt.

Take clean plastic bags back to your local retailer for recycling.

# Dead Aspens? Take Them Down But Replace With a Different Species

As I walked the Pinery and surrounding neighborhoods last summer I noticed quite a few dead and dying trees, most of them aspens and many close to roads, driveways and houses. These dead trees may seem stable enough now, but their roots are rotting away, and a strong wind is liable to topple them any time, possibly causing property damage or injury. Even a small tree can do a lot of damage. If you are sure the tree won't damage anything if it falls, you can leave it up to provide habitat for birds and other wildlife, otherwise you should plan to take the dead tree down.



Once other trees have leafed out, usually by late May, you can easily determine which ones need to be removed. Even if an aspen tree has a couple of branches with leaves on them it is only a matter of time before it finally gives out. Hiring a tree service for removal is strongly recommended. The risk of cutting a tree down and damaging property, ending up costing more than the removal, is high. They will dispose of the wood usually by grinding it up which makes good mulch and keeps it out of the landfill. If you have a fire-place or fire pit you can burn the larger pieces but aspens make poor firewood.

Some of the Pinery covenants require removed trees to be replaced with two trees but replacing them with another aspen is not recommended. Although aspens offer shade, texture and color for the landscape and are fast growing, they are not really suited for the Pinery's climate. Aspens do best at elevations above 7000' and, with the warmer summers we often experience, that is likely higher. Aspens in our microclimates are stressed by summers that are hot and dry which makes them more susceptible to diseases. Even healthy aspens have a relatively short life span. There are always exceptions; I have a nice healthy one in my own yard right now, but I have had to remove five dead and dying ones in the 25 years I've lived here.

So, what other choices do you have? Obviously, Ponderosa Pines do well here but if you want some diversity, which is always good, a local reputable nursery can recommend trees that should do well in the Pinery. Ask for species that can tolerate hot, dry summers and don't grow too fast because fast growth usually equals weakness and weak trees are less likely to withstand high winds and heavy snowfalls. Location in the landscape is also important and a replacement tree need not go in the same spot as the removed one. I like to plant evergreens on the north side of my property to block the winter winds and deciduous trees on the south and west side where they provide shade in the summer and let the sun through to warm my house in the winter. Keep in mind that a tree in a south or west exposure will require extra care and watering. You may want to have it planted by the nursery as the root ball can be very heavy and some nurseries will only guarantee the tree if they plant it. A tree service that will spray for pests and fertilize on a schedule will help the tree thrive.

Trees are an important part of the Pinery aesthetic and can add value to your property to say nothing of the value to wildlife habitat. But it's easy to take them for granted and neglect their care until one comes crashing down!

# Disposing of your brush, leaves and needles

## Pinery Trash Program

If you participate in The Pinery Trash Program with Waste Management you can have a total of 10 containers or bags of household trash and/or yard waste as part of your weekly service. Additionally, you can have 4 bundles of brush each week. Bundles need to be tied in string or rope and should not be longer than 4 feet.

If you have additional yard waste to be picked up, please contact Waste Management for a special pick-up. There will be a fee for this. Email Waste Management at <u>FCHOA@wm.com</u> or call at 303-797-1600 and identify yourself as a resident in The Pinery Preferred Hauler Program.

#### Flammable Plants

As we move into Spring and are looking at adding plants or changing the ones we have, you should be aware that some plants are highly flammable. These plants should be thirty (30) feet away from your house. The highly flammable plant we see a lot of in The Pinery is the Juniper. (insert a picture) Firefighters often refer to this plant as the green gas can. Conifers, such as Cypress and Douglas Fir trees are also pretty flammable.



Ponderosa Pines are more fire-resistant than Conifers but they are not fire-proof. If they are near your house, treat the tree as if it is part of your house and then move 30 feet of defensible space away from that tree. It is important to limb up trees 10-15 feet from the ground, trimming down the grasses and ladder fuels that carry the fire from the grass into the trees, and cleaning up those pine needles, dead leaves, and dead branches.

In The Pinery, we seek to balance the aesthetics of the area with fire safety. The covenants do require that Architectural Review is required before cutting down trees (not bushes). Depending on the filing you live in, there may be a requirement to replace trees taken down. Please contact the ARC at <u>ARC@Pinery.org</u> or 303-841-5305

# Plants for a FireWise Landscape

Plants that are more resistant to wildfire have one or more of the following characteristics:

- They grow without accumulating large amounts of combustible dead branches, needles or leaves.
- They have open, loose branches with a low volume of total vegetation.
- They have low sap or resin content (examples: many deciduous species).
- They have high moisture content (examples: succulents and some herbaceous species).
- They grow slowly and need little maintenance (do not need frequent pruning).
- They are short and grow close to the ground (examples: wildflowers and groundcovers).

# 2020 Slash/Mulch Site Opening Saturdays ONLY April 4 - October 31 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.

Due to the limited size of the slash/mulch site, all citizens visiting the site are requested to follow the Colorado regulations of wearing a face mask and social distance requirement of 6 feet while unloading slash or picking up mulch. Your cooperation and patience is appreciated.

Wildfire preparedness begins at home. Dispose of tree limbs, shrubs and brush properly.

Douglas County's slash-mulch site, at 1400 Caprice Drive in Castle Rock, opened April 4 and will remain open on Saturdays-only from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. through October 31. The perfect place to dispose of limbs, shrubs and brush, the site also gives residents the opportunity to go home with fresh mulch.

**Acceptable items include**: tree limbs, loose pine needles, shrubs, brush with a maximum length of 6 ft. and maximum diameter of 12 inches. Please note all loads must be covered when they arrive at the site.

Items that will not be accepted include: appliances, compost, decorative wood chips, fencing, leaves, pine cones, yucca plants, dirt, grass/hay, household trash/yard waste, lumber, railroad ties, roots, stumps and weeds.

During open season a County operated loader will be available to load free wood chips for homeowners to use as mulch. Material can be picked up anytime during the season the site is open to accept slash.

The Site Operator has the authority to refuse loads and require residents to reload and/or haul away materials found not to be in compliance with the regulations.

In the event of inclement weather, please call 303-663-6274 to ensure that the site will be open as scheduled.

The County respectfully requests that residents DO NOT leave materials anywhere on the site when it is closed/unattended.

Douglas County and the Wildfire Mitigation Specialists encourage property owners to use this opportunity to perform mitigation work and reduce hazardous fuels on their land. Douglas County Wildfire Mitigation Specialists offer free site visits to determine the safety of a property at no cost, upon request. Call 303.660.7497 to request a consultation for information on Wildfire Mitigation.
