

# Douglas County Emergency Notification System—CodeRED

#### **Development Application in The Pinery**

There is a 12.35 parcel of property North of The Pinery's North Park (bordered on the South by Sunridge Hollow Rd, Ponderosa Way and on the west by Betts Ranch Rd. and on the North and East by existing residential Development). A link to a map of the area is below. It is currently owned by the Douglas County School District. The original owners of The Pinery, donated it to the County, as required at that time, for a future school. The School District has identified that this is surplus property and has a pending contract with a developer. The developer is requesting that the zoning be changed on this property from school district site to single-family residential zoning.

The Pinery HOA has had two meetings with the developer, and the homes now proposed are 28 down from 33 and none of these homes will have driveways directly to existing roads. The Pinery HOA and residents submitted comments, as requested, to the Douglas County Planning Department in mid-June. Given all the building going on in the area, The Pinery HOA would like to have this area designated as Douglas County open space so that we continue to have an area for deer, fox, turkeys and other animals that reside there. These 12 acres are adjacent to our 5 acres in North Park, creating over a 17 acre area. If there are to be homes built on this property, The Pinery would only support significantly less custom homes which would fit with the larger lots right next to it in The Pinery and in the Hidden Village neighborhood. There are some additional concerns we have shared with the County, including that additional traffic entering onto Ponderosa Way (across from Falling Leaf Circle) will be a safety issue due to the decline and curve of the road in that area. On June 21, the Developer presented the proposed plans to residents at the Pinery Fire station. On August 25, The Pinery HOA held a meeting for residents to provide information on the process and what residents can do. The Developer will need to respond to the comments submitted. At a yet to be determined date, there will be a public meeting held by the Douglas County Planning Department. The Pinery will present at that meeting and residents may as well.

#### What you can do: Resident support can make the difference.

- Sign a petition at the HOA office or online.
- Write or email a letter to Mike Pesicka at the County. At this point the developer does not have to respond to the comments, however, the County will review letters and they go into the project file. Please send a copy to the PHA office. Use the link above for information on how to write a letter. - Attend the County Planning Commission Meeting we will publicize this when we know the date. We expect it will be on-line, as well as in-person.

Homeowner shall be solely responsible to the contracted trash service for any additional services requested which are not included in PHA's normal trash program. Homeowner acknowledges and agrees:  1) that PHA is merely acting as a billing agent for the contracted trash service; 2) that Homeowner shall not receive any refund upon termination of Homeowner's participation in the PHA trash program unless Homeowner provides advance notice to PHA, including address to which refund should be sent; and 3) that PHA will not be liable for any act or failure to act on the part of the contracted trash service, including, without limitation, violation of laws or regulations, injury or death to persons or animals and loss or damage to property or the environment.

#### Parking on the Public Road or Right of Way and Douglas County Ordinances

n The Pinery all the roads (not driveways) are public and owned by Douglas County. The public road includes approximately 15 feet on either side of the paved road. This area on either side of the road is referred to as the "Right of Way (ROW)". The ROW is an area that the homeowner is responsible for maintaining, however, it does fall under Douglas County Ordinance No. O-020-001 Regulations of Traffic and Parking.

We have had instances in The Pinery where people have been parked in such a way that 1) a Fire Truck would not be able to get through; 2) the garbage truck has not been able to get through to pick up trash; 3) residents have parked on the right of way/road and another resident cannot easily get out of their driveway, and

4) some residents are storing their Vehicles on the ROW.

You should be aware that Douglas County has the authority to **Impound Vehicles** (via towing or by installation of an immobilizing device or "boot") under the following circumstances, in accordance with Ordinance No.O-020-001, Part IV IM-POUNDS:

- if the Vehicle has been abandoned on a public right-ofway. For purposes of this Part IV, a Vehicle shall be deemed "abandoned" if it is inoperative (regardless of registration status) or
- if, after an abandoned vehicle notice has been placed on the Vehicle requiring that it be moved, the Vehicle has not been removed within 72 hours; or
- If the Vehicle is illegally parked, for any length of time: (1) in a manner that obstructs any roadway or emergency access; (2) in a fire

zone or in front of a fire hydrant; (3) in a manner that prevents any other Vehicle from being able to move; (4) in any area marked as a tow away zone; or (5) in any other circumstance where the Sheriff or a person acting under his authority determines that it would be unsafe for the Vehicle to remain illegally parked.

The cost of recovering an impounded Vehicle shall be the responsibility of the Owner of the Vehicle."

We encourage neighbors to speak to each other if they have a concern regarding where someone is parked. If corrective action is not taken, you can report a vehicle that is parked on the paved road or ROW and appears to be abandoned, or preventing another vehicle from getting around, by calling the Douglas County Sheriff's office's Traffic Safety Line at 303-666-7539.

#### Unacceptable items:

- no electric corded items, washers, dryers, ranges, microwaves
- No electronic waste such as computers, printers or monitors
- No hazardous waste, construction debris, car parts, hot tubs, basketball hoops, dirt, rock, concrete

# Douglas County Health Department Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Program

If you have paint from a recent project, old oil from your car's maintenance, or other hazardous waste from your recent DIY experience, Douglas County Health Department can help you safely dispose of it.

In place of a one-time annual event, the Douglas County Health Department is partnering with Waste Management to provide Douglas County residents with a low-cost service for household hazardous waste removal year-round. #### **Acceptable Items**:

- <u>Household Chemicals</u>: Ammonia, cleaning compounds, bleach, floor stripper, drain cleaner, rust remover, carpet/upholstery cleaner, tile/shower cleaner, and more
- <u>Automotive Products</u>: Antifreeze, motor oil, oil filters, fluids, polish, waxes, vehicle batteries, upholstery cleaners, and more
- <u>Consumer Electronics</u>: Computers, laptops, keyboards, monitors, microwaves, DVD/CD players, CD ROM, fax machines, cell phones, VCRs, desktop printers, scanners, gaming systems, related cords, and more
- <u>Paint Products</u>: Oil-based paint, latex paint, spray paint, artist paint, wood preservative, stain, caulk, sealer and more
- Batteries: Batteries of various sizes: AA, AAA, C, D and rechargeable.
- Garden Chemicals: Herbicide, insect spray/insecticide, fertilizer, pesticide, and more
- Fluorescent Light Bulbs: Compact fluorescent lamps (CFL) and straight fluorescent tubes
- Thermometers and thermostats: Numerous items that contain mercury
- Flammable Items: Kerosene, gasoline, solvents and more
- Syringes and Lancets: Sharps, syringes, needles and lancets
- Swimming Pool Chemicals: Pool acid, stabilizer, chlorine

<u>Unacceptable items</u>: asbestos, ammunition and explosives, biological waste, medicines and prescriptions, commercial or business supplies, unknown or unlabeled materials, trash, including bulky items and furniture, incandescent light bulbs, appliances: washing machines, vacuums, tools, or refrigerators, tires, containers over 5 gallons, lamp fixtures, liquid mercury, leaking or empty containers, construction related materials, radioactive items, smoke detectors, items improperly packaged for transportation

#### County's Slash-Mulch Site Opened for the Season on April 2

Did you know that removing tree limbs, shrubs and brush from your property is essential for wildfire risk reduction? Good news – Douglas County provides a location to dispose of this unwanted slash.

Douglas County's <u>slash-mulch site</u>, at **1400 Caprice Drive in Castle Rock**, opened April 2 and will remain open on Saturdays only from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. through October 29. This is the perfect place to dispose of limbs, shrubs and brush. The site also gives residents the opportunity to go home with fresh mulch.

Acceptable items include tree limbs, loose pine needles, shrubs, brush with a maximum length of 6 feet and maximum diameter of 12 inches. Please note all loads must be covered upon arrival to the slash-mulch site. \*\* Absolutely no dumping allowed Monday through Friday\*\*

<u>Unacceptable items include</u>: appliances, compost, decorative wood chips, dirt, fencing, grass / hay, household trash / yard waste, leaves, lumber / pallets / railroad ties, pine cones, roots / stumps, weeds, yucca plants.

During open season a County operated loader will be available to load free wood chips for homeowners to use as mulch. Material can be picked up anytime during the season the site is open to accept slash.

In the event of inclement weather, please call 303.663.6274 to ensure that the site will be open as scheduled.

Please note the Slash-Mulch site in Douglas County is for Douglas County residents only.
