

1 Large item only!

5 additional bags of yard debris allowed (each less than 40 lbs.) and/or branches cut down to less than 4 feet, bundled and tied. Items must be able to be easily carried, handled and tossed.

Acceptable items: Couches, loveseats, recliners, mattresses, box springs (all sizes), bed frames, tables, chairs, BBQ grills

Unacceptable items: no electric corded items, washers, dryers, ranges, microwaves

- No electronic waste such as computers, printers or monitors
- No hazardous waste, construction debris, car parts, hot tubs, basketball hoops, dirt, rock, concrete

PHA Trash & Recycle Program Enrollment Form

The Pinery Homeowners' Association invites you to participate in the Trash and Recycle Program offered to Pinery residents.

Trash is picked up every Wednesday and recycling items are picked up every other Wednesday.

Each household may order two complementary carts 64 gallon and/or 96 gallon. There will be a \$25 delivery fee. (*You may order below.*)

For a large or bulk item pick up, schedule with Apex Waste Connections for a small fee **303-841-7144**. See our website, **PHA@pinery.org** for more details.

All trash starts must be received in the PHA office no later than 1 p.m. on the Monday prior to the desired Wednesday service day. Trash carts will be delivered in 7—10 days.

AGREEMENT

By submitting this enrollment form with initial payment, the above Pinery resident and/or homeowner ("Homeowner") hereby authorizes The Pinery Homeowners' Association, Inc. ("PHA") to engage its contracted trash service to collect and dispose of Homeowner's normal household waste materials at the above described Pinery residence. Homeowner warrants that all waste materials offered for collection will not contain any hazardous, toxic or radioactive wastes or substances as defined by applicable federal, state or local laws or regulations. Homeowner agrees to pay PHA in advance within 15 days of billing for trash service at the PHA's then current rates until such time as Homeowner notifies PHA of Homeowner's termination from the PHA trash program. Failure to pay as specified which results in rebilling and/or termination will incur fees to cover the PHA cost of these actions. Homeowner shall be solely responsible to the contracted trash service for any additional services requested which are not included in PHA's normal trash program. Homeowner acknowledges and agrees:

1) that PHA is merely acting as a billing agent for the contracted trash service; 2) that Homeowner shall not receive any refund upon termination of Homeowner's participation in the PHA trash program unless Homeowner provides advance notice to PHA, including address to which refund should be sent; and 3) that PHA will not be liable for any act or failure to act on the part of the contracted trash service, including, without limitation, violation of laws or regulations, injury or death to persons or animals and loss or damage to property or the environment.

County's Slash-Mulch Site Opened for the Season on April 1 Please note the Slash-Mulch site in Douglas County is for Douglas County residents only.

Did you know that removing tree limbs, shrubs and brush from your property is essential for wildfire risk reduction? Good news – Douglas County provides a location to dispose of this unwanted slash. Douglas County's <u>slash-mulch site</u>, at **1400 Caprice Drive in Castle Rock**, opened April 1 and will remain open on Saturdays only from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. through October 28. This is the perfect place to dispose of limbs, shrubs and brush. The site also gives residents the opportunity to go home with fresh mulch.

Acceptable items include tree limbs, loose pine needles, shrubs, brush with a maximum length of 6 feet and maximum diameter of 12 inches. Please note all loads must be covered upon arrival to the slashmulch site. **** Absolutely no dumping allowed Monday through Friday****

<u>Unacceptable items include</u>: appliances, compost, decorative wood chips, dirt, fencing, grass / hay, household trash / yard waste, leaves, lumber / pallets / railroad ties, pine cones, roots / stumps, weeds, yucca plants.

During open season a County operated loader will be available to load free wood chips for homeowners to use as mulch. Material can be picked up anytime during the season the site is open to accept slash. In the event of inclement weather, please call 303.663.6274 to ensure that the site will be open as scheduled.

Please note the Slash-Mulch site in Douglas County is for Douglas County residents only.

Yard Waste-NOT!

We want to encourage our residents to put their YARD CLIP-PINGS to good use.

What are YARD CLIPPINGS? They are NOT WASTE, but in most cases can and should be put back into the soil. What does that mean?

For example, when you cut your **grass**, do you attach a bag to your mower and throw it into a garbage bag for trash day? Here's a better use for that grass. Do not cut your grass too short (dries out quicker in the heat), but let it grow to the level of your "high" setting on the mower. Do not put a bag on the mower, but let it stay on the grass. It will dry out in a few days. Grass dries out easily as it lies on the mowed surface. In some cases, you may have to take clumps and scatter them with a soft rake.

Another use for the grass is to build a compost box/container and throw some of it in the box/container. The use of a compost box (there is no smell when used properly) is great to add to your flower and shrub beds when the soil is ready to be emptied from box/ container.

Branches and other tree/shrub clippings should be "chipped"/ ground up and the chips used in your landscape. Place in shrub beds, around tree wells, etc.

For example, wait to prune/cut branches whenever possible and make use of our **annual fire mitigation chipper days**. Usually in the fall. Watch for date(s) in newsletter.

If you have storm damage and cannot do any of the above, there are 2 reasonable options:

- Hire a tree service to come chip the branches for you and they can haul them off and be used elsewhere.
- Take branches/logs to the Douglas County's Slash-Mulch site at 1400 Caprice Dr., Castle Rock.

Throwing biodegradable yard clippings in the trash should be avoided. This is a valuable resource that can be used in our landscapes AND reduces the trash stream.
