Acceptable items: Couches, loveseats, recliners, mattresses, box springs (all sizes), bed frames, tables, chairs, BBQ grills, empty lawnmowers, toiletss

Unacceptable items:

- No electric corded items, washers, dryers, ranges, microwaves, water heaters
- No electronic waste such as computers, printers or monitors
- No hazardous waste, constructions debris, car parts, hot tubs, basketball hoops, dirt, rock concrete, water heaters


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Architectural Review Committee: 2024 Activity Summary

Why You Should Recycle

If you are not recycling much of what you throw in your trash, you should.

Here is why...

Either way, recycle or trash, we pay for it. Put about 75-80% of your trash to good use by recycling.

Myth: the recyclables go in the trash anyway, so what's the point?

To explore this myth, our family toured a Waste Management recycling facility in north Denver that takes the materials our trash company, Apex, "takes from us." Apex and many other trash companies deliver to this facility, tons of valuable recyclable materials, every single hour of the day.

These materials are sorted by workers on assembly lines that are in turn packaged for delivery and sale to companies that transform them into products you and I purchase every day.

What Happens To My Recyclables?

- Aluminum cans be recycled an infinite amount of times
- Plastic bottles can be flaked, pelletized and spun into fiber or create composite decking
- Cardboard boxes usually become new cardboard boxes
- Soda can cases or cereal boxes degrade and become newspaper
- Glass is recycled bottle-tobottle through a local company (Glass to Glass-Brighton)

Home Ignition Zone 2: Creating a barrier!

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO TO PREPARE YOUR HOME FOR WILDFIRE THREATS

We continue our discussion this NFPA and Co State Forest month on what to prioritize when Services recommendations for preparing your home and property for wildfire prevention. Last newsletter, we focused on the first 5 feet of the home.

Now we bring our focus to the next 5-30 feet or "Zone 2". This zone encompasses a majority of . landscaping features that require maintainance but provides a critical buffer between your home and a possible wildfire.

NFPA and Colorado State Forest • Services recommend keeping this area clear of built up slash and flammable materials.

Zone 2:

- · keeping lawns mowed to a height of 4 inches or less
- clearing out ladder fuels by pruning tree branches 6-10 feet from ground, depending on height
- pruning agressive bushes every 3-5 years
- creating fuel breaks between driveways, decks, walkways, and patios
- pruning trees to not overhang homes
- ensuring your address is visible by chosing reflective, non combustible material, close to the street

By maintaining your landscaping, you are creating a defensible barrier around your home!

FAQ'S

Q: How often will my trash and recycle be serviced?

A: Trash is picked up every Wednesday.

Recycle is picked up every other Wednesday.

Q: What time and where should I set out my trash & recycling on pick-up days?

A: Please place your trash and recycling at the curb by 7:00 AM on your scheduled pick-up day. Our Apex team will collect materials between 7:00 AM and 7:00 PM. While pick-up times may vary by neighborhood, this 12-hour window allows us to accommodate any unexpected challenges, such as weather conditions, truck maintenance, or changes in our driver schedules. Please place cart handles toward the curb.

Q: What holidays does Apex observe and how will my service be impacted?

At Apex observes New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. If one of these holidays falls on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday, please expect that service will be delayed by one day.

Q: What if my trash & recycling pick up day is impacted by inclement weather?

Our Apex team will work with the PHA office to provide updated communication to the best of our ability considering unknown weather developments. If necessary, we will communicate a recovery schedule for when our drivers can SAFELY service your community. We thank you in advance for your patience! *Please be mindful that when area schools are closed, this is a good indication that neighborhoods and main roads may be unsafe for APEX drivers to service your community.

Q: What if my trash/recycling was not picked up on the scheduled day?

A: If your trash or recycling was placed curbside by 7:00 AM and not picked up by 7:00 PM on your scheduled service day, please contact our Customer Service Team within 24-48 hours. We will review our truck video footage from your route to confirm any missed pick-ups. If it is determined that a pick-up was missed, we will contact you to determine next steps.

In place of a one-time annual event, the Douglas County Health Department is partnering with Waste Management to provide Douglas County residents with a low-cost service for household hazardous waste removal year-round. Acceptable Items:

- <u>Household Chemicals</u>: Ammonia, cleaning compounds, bleach, floor stripper, drain cleaner, rust remover, carpet/upholstery cleaner, tile/shower cleaner, and more
- <u>Automotive Products</u>: Antifreeze, motor oil, oil filters, fluids, polish, waxes, vehicle batteries, upholstery cleaners, and more
- <u>Consumer Electronics</u>: Computers, laptops, keyboards, monitors, microwaves, DVD/CD players, CD ROM, fax machines, cell phones, VCRs, desktop printers, scanners, gaming systems, related cords, and more
- <u>Paint Products</u>: Oil-based paint, latex paint, spray paint, artist paint, wood preservative, stain, caulk, sealer and more
- **Batteries**: Batteries of various sizes: AA, AAA, C, D and rechargeable.
- Garden Chemicals: Herbicide, insect spray/ insecticide, fertilizer, pesticide, and more
- Fluorescent Light Bulbs: Compact fluorescent lamps (CFL) and straight fluorescent tubes
- Thermometers and thermostats: Numerous items that contain mercury
- Flammable Items: Kerosene, gasoline, solvents and more
- Syringes and Lancets: Sharps, syringes, needles and lancets
- Swimming Pool Chemicals: Pool acid, stabilizer, chlorine

<u>Unacceptable items</u>: asbestos, ammunition and explosives, biological waste, medicines and prescriptions, commercial or business supplies, unknown or unlabeled materials, trash, including bulky items and furniture, incandescent light bulbs, appliances: washing machines, vacuums, tools, or refrigerators, tires, containers over 5 gallons, lamp fixtures, liquid mercury, leaking or empty containers, construction related materials, radioactive items, smoke detectors, items improperly packaged for transportation

The system, CodeRED, is a high-speed telephone emergency notification service allowing public safety agencies the ability to deliver pre-recorded information to targeted areas within the county.

Douglas County's public safety agencies encourage everyone to register their contact information in the CodeRED system (reverse 911). Registration is not automatic, but it may be critical to your safety and that of your family.
